he University of Agriculture, Abeokuta (UNAAB), has trained hundreds of rural dwellers and empowered numerous other villagers in its neighborhood, in the last

one year through the Agricultural Media Resource and Extension Centre (AMREC).

The beneficiaries are mostly Igede, Fulani and Yoruba peasants, cattle rearers and petty traders who reside in neighbouring villages, which include Agbede, Kofesu, Oluwo-Keesi, Labuta, Kango, Isolu, Ojoo, Oluwaseyi, Owe, Ogboja, Alabata, Kootu and Adao.

According to the AMREC 2009 Annual Report, 30 farmers, cattle rearers and traders were taught basic arts of reading and writing at Alagbede Village under the UNAAB Neighbourhood Adult Literacy Project.

The beneficiaries graduated in January 2010 and the Vice-Chancellor of UNAAB, Professor Oluwafemi Olaiya Balogun, represented by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) Prof. Chryss Onwuka presented them with Certificates of Participation.

Also, another batch of 66 inhabitants of Adao Community and environs also benefited from the Village Based Capacity-Building Training for Farm Families on "Processing

Similarly, a Pre-Season Training for 37 farmers, drawn from Agbesu, Kofesu, Kango, Ogboja, Isolu, Labuta and Ilugun Communities took place in April, last year.

Resource persons, including Prof. K.A. Okeleye, Dr. A.O. Oni, Dr. G. Sokoya, Mr. M.A. Jayeola, Mrs. O.T. Irekhore, and Mrs. A.O. Adeyeye trained the villagers on current trends and developments as it affects cultivation of maize, soybean, rice and cassava.

The report further showed that UNAAB also organized a Sensitization and Awareness Campaign on Avian Influenza (bird flu) for 60 Farmers in Agbede, Kofesu, Oluwo-Keesi, Labata, Kango, Isolu, Ojoo, Oluwaseyi, Ogboja, Alabata, Kootu and Adao.

According to the Director of AMREC, Professor F. K. Salako, the training and empowerment programmes of neighbouring villagers, were in line with the tripodal mandate of the University, one of which is the Extension Services.

COREN Lifts UNAAR:

... Donates 10 Desktop Computers Says more goodies are in the pipeline

he Council for the Regulation of Engineering in Nigeria (COREN), has donated ten Desktop Computers and other accessories to the Department of Civil Engineering of the University,

without a deliberate policy to develop its engineering knowledge and facilities.

According to him, the quest for infrastructural development

as part of efforts at supporting the teaching of Engineering programmes in the nation's Ivory Towers.

The Computers were formally presented to the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Oluwafemi Olaiya Balogun by COREN President, Engr. Ahmed Gumel.

Moments after the presentation, Gumel expressed belief that the gesture would spur the University to do more for the Department of Civil Engineering, adding that the donation was the beginning of other planned support for the University.

Engr. Gumel then called on stakeholders in education to give Faculties of Engineering in the nation's Universities top priority, observing that no nation can develop can only be achieved, when a robust indigenous engineering capacity is encouraged to thrive.

He commended the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Balogun and other Principal Officers as well as the Dean of College of Engineering, Professor E. S. A. Ajisegiri, for a job well done.

Earlier in his remarks, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Balogun who was visibly overwhelmed by the COREN's gesture, reiterated his genuine commitment to nurture the College of Engineering to a model in the country.

He assured that the computers would be put to the best use, to enhance the teaching and learning of Engineering in the University.

Management Okays CBT for Examinations

n a bid to sustain its academic reputation, the authorities of the University have concluded plans to introduce the *Computer Base Testing* (CBT) technology for examinations.

The Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Professor Chryss Onwuka, revealed this during a chat with **UNAAB BULLETIN** in his office.

Professor Onwuka said the CBT would be adopted in the University because of its technological advancement and the likely advantage to hasten examination conduct and results processing.

The Deputy Vice-Chancellor however urged Students to catchup with the technological challenges that would be posed by the machine, saying "the Students should expect such challenge, afterall, we are in the computer age".

He encouraged the newly admitted Students to take advantage of the on-going ICT training to upgrade their computer literacy, as it will be of help in their study, particularly to be grounded in the CBT application.

The University hitherto used the Optical Mark Recognition (OMR) machines to conduct its examinations, all in the effort to provide examination credibility.

The Vice-Chancellor, Professor Oluwafemi Olaiya Balogun dropped the hint during the inauguration of the 2009/2010 Executive of the Student Union, on Tuesday, April 6, 2010 at the Julius Okojie Lecture Theatre Complex, UNAAB, Abeokuta.

In his revelation, the Vice-Chancellor assured the gathering that "in a few weeks time, seven brand new Luxury Buses would be delivered to augment the existing fleet".

According to Professor Balogun, the purchase of the buses became necessary in order to stem the perennial transportation problem, often faced by Students.

Apart from the seven buses being awaited, the Vice-Chancellor also informed of two additional buses donated by the Federal Government to the School, with one of them, a Marcopolo Luxury copolo bus as a plus to UNAAB, thanking the Federal Government for the generosity, which was extended to all Federal Universities in the country.

COLLAPSED BUILDINGS: Stop Blaming Engineers- COREN President cries out

he President of the Council for the Regulation of Engineering in Nigeria (COREN), Engr. H.A Gumel has urged Nigerians to stop blaming Civil Engineers for the spate of collapsed buildings in the country.

The nation, in the past years, has been rocked with frequent cases of collapsed buildings with attendant avoidable killing and maiming of people.

Worst hit are Lagos, Abuja, Ibadan and of recent, Abeokuta, the capital city of Ogun State. Condemning the development, Gumel blamed the spate on quacks who according to him engage in building construction, without the required expertise or recourse to standard rules and provisions of COREN.

Gumel therefore called on Nigerians to stop heaping the blame of incessant collapse of buildings on registered members of COREN, with an assurance that COREN was leaving no stone unturned towards nipping the menace of quackery in the bud.

The COREN boss advised Nigerians to always engage the services of experts for their building constructions.
