According to the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Professor Chyrss Onwuka, the University authorities created seven Centres with an 8-Man Panel for each, as well as seven Coordinators and a Chief Coordinator, to ensure a smooth exercise.

He further informed that each Centre was manned by highly experienced Administrators, Psychologists and Security Personnel, adding that 3,150 candidates were invited for screening.

The Deputy Vice-Chancellor pointed out that the sole aim of the screening was to ensure that only the

Council Approves IFSERAR Replaces RESDEC

he Governing Council has approved the transformation of the Research and Development Centre (RESDEC) of the University into an Institute of Food Security, Environmental Resources and Agricultural Research (IFSERAR).

Adeboye, for the Registrar and Secretary to Council, the transformation was approved, to offer the required structures and resources that can adequately address the research mandate of the University.

The approval was given at the 62nd Statutory Meeting of the Governing Council and it came on the heels of Senate's proposal for the transformation at its 178th Statutory Meeting, held December, last year.

According to the Council's Decision Extract, signed by Mr. A.O.

The Council agreed with the University Senate, that the establishment of a Research Institute will further help in the delivery on new crop varieties, improved livestock breeds as well as the development of improved production and processing technologies.

.... Reinstates 500-Level Student

eanwhile, the Governing Council has reinstated Mr. Bamidele Lebile, a 500-Level Student, in the Department of Plant Breeding and Seed Technology.

Mr. Lebile was dismissed from the University by Senate during the 2^{nd} Semester of the 2007/2008 Academic Session for defrauding the Ondo State Government through its Bursary Award.

It would be recalled that the University Community had during the New Year thanksgiving service, pleaded for leniency for Mr. Lebile, on the ground that he had demonstrated adequate remorse and to also 'save his future' as an aspiring young adult.

The Council had therefore directed based on the plea, for the reinstatement of Mr. Lebile to 500 Level

in the next Academic Session.

The Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Oluwafemi Olaiya Balogun has been reiterating that no erring student would be spared the rod, insisting however, that justice will be tempered with mercy when there is reasonable plea for pardon.

Professor Balogun who was represented by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Development), Professor Segun Lagoke, called for a change of orientation in people, who believed that it was only those in authority that perpetrate corruption.

According to him, every individual that is capable of differentiating between right and wrong, but fails to do the right thing or awaits monetary inducement before carrying out his duty, is guilty of the offence.

Mrs. Kuforiji observed that prior to the oil boom, public servants in Nigeria were highly respected, but lamented the downturn, orchestrated by lack of discipline, honesty, accountability, punctuality and productivity.

To restore the lost glory, the Director advised that it was imperative for organisations to have laid down rules and guidelines, which must be made available to workers, to guide them in the discharge of their duties.

She called on organizations to adopt the 'carrot and stick' diplomacy in rewarding and sanctioning staff as appropriate, while departmental heads should be exemplary in their conduct, adding that no worker should be above the law.
