Speaking on the welfare of students, the Vice-Chancellor revealed that the University boasts of state-ofthe-art facilities and serene environment, to provide the perfect setting for quality education, for its students.

He also assured the new intakes, that the University had sufficient accommodation for students, with an assurance that lectures would be delivered under conducive atmosphere.

Professor Balogun pointed out that Management has concluded plans for additional nine brand new buses that would soon be delivered, to ease the problem of transportation.

How Mgmt Tackles Transport challenges in 2009 — MANCOT

he University's Management Committee on Transportation (MANCOT), has called on the

Management to establish specialized mechanic workshop and employ technical staff to effectively handle repairs and maintenance of the increasing fleet of buses on campus.

MANCOT in its 2009 Annual Report signed by the Chairman, Dr. J. J. Atungwu said this initiative would "save cost and safeguard against tampering and vandalisation".

Dr. Atungwu said the Committee was able to sustain a solid maintenance culture, by ensuring direct sourcing and procurement of vehicle spare parts.

The Report provided insight into how the Management was able to drastically reduce transportation challenges, especially as it affects the student population in 2009, by boosting the number of buses in its fleet, by an additional four.

According to the Committee, the sharp increase in the number of buses in the University Pool from eight to twelve, contributed tremendously to efficient transportation service delivery, for the teeming students.

The Committee Chairman said, "the number of mass transit buses in MANCOT fleet increased significantly when on March 20, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Oluwafemi

mosele handed over four brand new factory-fitted air conditioned 30-seater Coaster buses to the Dean of Student Affairs.

The Dean then handed over the buses to MANCOT. The additional buses brought to 12 the total number of buses in MANCOT fleet", he added.

The Report further informed that apart from boosting the number of buses, the Management through MANCOT has been able to generate employment and create wealth by increasing the number of drivers and other staff in its fold.

MANCOT commended the University Management, especially the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Oluwafemi Olaiya Balogun for making efficient transportation system in the University, a top priority.

Maiyaki, the L'Oreal Foundation in collaboration with UNESCO has offered to finance 15 Fellowships, for the promotion of young women who are engaged in researches in Life Sciences, all over the world.

According to the release, the research in Life Sciences will enhance the involvement of deserving young women scientists, in research that can contribute actively to the solution of challenging problems.


As an impetus, the L'Oreal Foundation has allocated the sum of US\$600,00 divided into 15 Fellowships of US\$40,000 each, over a period of two years for women scientists that fulfilled the requirements.


UNAAB Re-Appoints Atungwu - Deputy Dean & MANCOT Chair

NAAB Chief Coach, Mr. Victor Osuntolu has expressed confidence that the University is capable of hosting the 2010 edition of the Nigeria University Games (NUGA), Zone-F Preliminaries.

Osuntolu sounded confident in an exclusive report he sent to **UNAAB BULLETIN**'s Desk.

The Chief Coach disclosed that the University's new sport facilities, put in place by the incumbent administration, had put UNAAB in good stead of hosting the forthcoming Games.

He revealed that there were strong indications from the University 'glass house' that UNAAB might bid for the hosting of the events.

According to him, hosting would afford members of the Community to watch live displays, as contingents compete for honours in Football (men), Basketball (men/women), Volleyball (men/women), Handball (men/women), Hockey (men/women), Judo (men/women), and Cricket (men).

Other events include Swimming (men/women), Taekwondo (men/women), Tennis (men/women), Badminton (men/women), and Athletics (men/women).

The Chief Coach further informed that Zone-F which has been described as deadly, consists of ten institutions, including the University of Agriculture, Abeokuta (UNAAB), University of Ibadan (UI), University of Lagos (UNILAG), Leads University, Ibadan and Lagos State University, Ojoo.

Others are, The Bells University of Technology, Ota, Redeemers University, Mowe, Tai Solarin University of Education TASUED, Olabisi Onabanjo University, Ago-Iwoye and Babcock University, Ilisan.
