# **Council Amends Staff Rules and Regulations**

he Governing Council of the University has amended some sections of the Senior and Junior Staff Rules and Regulations at its 62<sup>nd</sup> Statutory Meeting of February 16, 2010.

According to a release signed by Mr. Leke Adeboye, for the Registrar, the amendments are as follows:

**Section 9.1. for Senior Staff**: The date of retirement for members of staff holding tenure appointment, to the age of retirement, is the end of the Academic Year following the attainment of the age of 65 years for Academic Staff and the anniversary of their 60 years birthday for Non-Teaching Staff.

Section 10.1 for Junior Staff: The date of retirement for members of staff holding tenure appointment to the

age of retirement is the anniversary of their 60 years birthday.

Section 4.10. for Senior Staff: Every confirmed Senior member of Staff (Academic and Non-Teaching) on CONTISS 13/CONUASS 5 and above will be entitled to one year Sabbatical Leave with full pay. The Leave will be either to gain practical experience in a particular field of specialisation that will enhance the effectiveness and efficiency of such Staff or to carry out research and interact with professional colleagues as well as undertake some teaching assignments.

**Section 4.10.9. for Senior Staff**: Staff on Sabbatical Leave shall return to the University, for at least one Academic Session, on completion of Leave, except Staff who are embarking on Terminal Sabbatical Leave.

## **SME: Experts Decry Poor Funding** ... At NAAT Lecture

ederal Government and other stakeholders have been called upon to create enabling atmosphere for the survival of small scale industries and indigenous technology in particular, as means of resuscitating the nation's ailing economy.

The duo of the Pro-Chancellor and Chairman, Governing Council, University of Agriculture, Abeokuta, UNAAB. Chief Olakunle Osayemi and the Vice-Chancellor, Federal University drawing board by fashioning out ways of growing and utilizing the nation's economic potentials optimally.

Also in his Lecture titled "Indigenous Technology: An imperative for National Development", the Vice-Chancellor of Federal University of Technology, Akure (FUTA), Professor Adebisi Balogun said that the ongoing campaign for the entrenchment of small scale enterprise would be a mirage should federal government

of Technology, Akure, (FUTA), Professor Adebisi Balogun made the call at the maiden Annual Lecture and the Awards Ceremony of the National Association of Academic Technologist (NAAT), UNAAB Branch, held at the Julius Okojie Lecture Theatre Complex.

Chief Osayemi who was the Chairman of the occasion had in his remarks set the ball rolling, lamenting that the nation was far from utilizing its economic potentials compared to developing economies like Malaysia.

He noted with dismay that Malaysia through the oil palm seeds it took from Nigeria some years ago had been able to turn around its economy for good while its benefactor (Nigeria) was yet to realize the benefits of her oil palm seeds and the potentials of other natural endowments.

Chief Osayemi, an industrialist, charged Government to revert to the

failed to motivate and boost indigenous technology.

He decried a situation where government and other stakeholders are channeling and diverting resources meant for small and medium scale industries only to "high sounding industries" as a misplaced priority , which might be counter-productive at the end of the day.

According to him, "there's no way small scale industries can survive without indigenous technology. If we are concentrating efforts only on our high sounding industries, we may be far away from development".

Prof. Balogun who commended NAAT, UNAAB branch for the timeliness of the Lecture pointed out that the role of Technologists was crucial to nation building.

He, however, frowned at NAAT romance with the Non-Teaching Staff Unions under the umbrella of Joint Action Congress (JAC) as injurious to its attaining high level professional-ism.

The Vice-Chancellor said NAAT was more of Academic Staff, as Technologists and Researchers are partners in progress and their roles are complementary.

Earlier in his speech, the Vice-Chancellor, University of Agriculture, Abeokuta (UNAAB) Professor Oluwafemi Olaiya Balogun described members of the National Association of Academic Technologist (NAAT) as major stakeholders in the smooth running of the University system.

Professor Balogun encouraged indigenous technology and frowned at excessive copying and importation of foreign technologies.

On his part, the National President of the Association, Dr. Ijagbone represented by Mr. J.O. Amira urged all stakeholders and Technologist to come together for a better appreciation of the profession.

The occasion also witnessed presentation of Meritorious Awards to outstanding personalities, where the Administrator, Works & Services of the University, Professor Samuel Adejuigbe bagged Technologist of Repute award.

Other categories of Awards went to individuals and corporate organizations. Elder 'Yemi Akinwonmi received an award of excellence in Building industry category, while RATTAWU National President, Comrade Yemisi Bamgbose was awarded for Active Unionism.

Winelight Analytical Systems Limited, Animal Care Services, National Salt Company of Nigeria, Winteck Nigeria Limited and Steve Nicholas Nigeria Limited, also received awards.

Also at the ceremony, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, **Professor Olaiya Balogun** unveiled the model of the proposed new secretariat of the association.
