Council Change UNAAB's foundation Day To Jan.1 — Following Management Proposal

he Governing Council of University of Agriculture, Abeokuta (UNAAB) has approved the changed of the Foundation Day of the institution from January 28th to January 1.

The Change was contain in the Decision Extract of the 63rd Statutory Meeting of the Governing Council signed by the Registrar and Secretary to Council, Mr. Adeleke Adeboye.

According to the Extract, Councils's approval came on the heels of a proposal from Management to change the Foundation Day of the University to January 1, the actual day of the establishment of the University, in line with global practice.

It picked hole in the adoption of January 28 as the University Foundation Day, being the date the Foundation Vice-Chancellor assumed duty.

Council, however, justified January 1 as the true representation of the University Foundation Day having noted that UNAAB was established by the Federal Government on January 1, 1988.

Council Transforms CENHURD TO INHURD — Rename Linkage As CENIP

— Following Senate Recommendation

n what appears as a gale of the Governing Council of the University of Agriculture, Abeokuta (UNAAB) has approved the transformation of the Centre for Human Resources Development (CENHURD) to Institution for Human Resources and Development (INHURD).

In the same vein, the Council also ratified the renaming of Directorate of Linkages and Partnership as Centre for Internalisation and Partnerships (CENIP).

According to Extract of the 63rd Statutory Meeting of the Governing Council signed by the Acting Registrar and Secretary to Council, Mr. Adeleke Adeboye, the transformation of the two vital organs of the University came on the heels of recommendations of Senate to the Council at its meeting of the 27th May, 2010.

Approving the transformation of CENHURD to INHURD, Council noted among other things the strong demand for the programme being offered in the Centre, a development which has sharply increased students enrolment from about 1000 at inception in 2002 to 2,500 at present.

Council also noted that an Institute usually has a higher profile and

capacity for greater recognition and more clientele than a Centre.

It further reasoned that an Institute has a large scope to develop, offer and run programmes at subdegree, undergraduate and postgraduate levels.

Justifying the renaming of Directorate of Linkages and Partnership as Centre for Internationalization and Partnerships, Council noted that the degree of Internationalization has become one of the strongest parameters in global ranking and that most institutions, especially in the developed countries have established Centres specially dedicated for Internationalization purposes.

he Governing Council of the University has approved the composition of the Governing Board of the Institute for Human Resources and Development (INHURD) with it new nominee, Dr. S.O. Oladiti as Chairman.

The approval was contained in a release signed by the Registrar and Secretary to Council, Mr. Adeleke

Adeboye.

According to it, though Council noted that the proposed Governing Board of INHURD was similar to the existing Board of CENHURD, it further noted that a major change was an increase of Council Nominee on the Board from one to two apart from the Board Chairman who is also a Council Nominee.

INHURD Hands-over Computer Centre To ICTREC

University of Agriculture, Abeokuta, has now been formally handed over to Information and Communication Technology Resources Centre (ICTREC).

Speaking at the handing over ceremony, the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Professor Chryss Onwuka represented by the Chairman, Committee of Deans and Directors (CODAD) in the University, Professor S. O. Awonorin charged ICTREC to justify the confidence repose in them by utilizing the Centre adequately.

Professor Onwuka also called on the ICTREC and INHURD to collaborate in the area of organizing coaching classes for the secondary school students in the area, most especially final year students, noting that it will be another source of income for the Centre apart from the usual ICT trainings. ding environment at Iberekodo conducive for various ICT activities.

Dr. Oguntoye also stressed that CISCO Academy at the Alabata Main Campus of the institution will also be moved to Iberekodo Centre, while some of the ICTREC staff at the permanent site have been redeployed to the Centre.

Commenting on the underutilization of the building, the Director of the Institute of Human Resources Development (INHURD), Dr. Taofiq Salisu said the place is still being underutilized. He, however, called on the ICTREC Director to fully utilize the Centre.

Dr. Salisu also enjoined the Director to turn-around the place with everything he has in his power and ensure adequate power supply to the Centre by having a stand by generator which will be an alternative to public power supply.

Vice Chancellor (Development), Professor Segun Olagoke, acknowledged as boundless, the long existing relationship between UNAAB and Nestle, which can be traced back to 1995.

The Vice Chancellor, in his words, noted the importance of the need for a purposeful, realistic and mutually-benefiting collaboration with Non-Governmental Agencies like Nestle.

He added that this will go a long way at contributing to the realization of an effective and sustainable agricultural development within the South-West Zone and Nigeria as a whole.

Professor Balogun commended Nestle for its momentous contribution to the production of high yielding Soya Beans and the sponsoring of the Farm Family Health Project in four South Western States of the Country.

The Vice Chancellor noted that Nestle has for these entire project and many more donated the unprecedented amount of 29,950,000 for execution.

Commenting on the overall involvement of Nestle, the Director of Agricultural Media Resource and Education Centre (AMREC), Professor Kola Salako stated that farmers have with the aid of Nestle, gained an exceptional technical-know-how, which has positively improved the output of grain production.

He added that the great challenges of low input production of grain product in Nigeria and Africa are beginning to erode.

The Soil Physics expert therefore identified the aims of the partnership, as to sensitizing farmers on the potential economic benefit in the production of soya beans, encouraging high production of quality seeds that will enhance the production level of beverage companies like Nestle.


