She pointed out that "environmental legislation is very vital for the modern society, if its goals must be

She expressed joy that UNAAB has contributed immensely to the conservation and efficient utilization of the nation's biological resources over the years.

Delivering a Lecture to mark the 2010 World Environment Day in the institution and titled "The Legal Instrument for Environmental Management in Nigeria", Prof. Fubara, said "we cannot undermine the role of law in the challenges facing us as a nation, particularly in the development of appropriate laws for the management of the Nigerian environment".

She stressed that international and national environmental law constitutes one of the critical components of capacity building in the modern context, adding that the combined force of the Federal Ministry of Environment and its enforcement parastatals like the National Environmental' Standards and Regulations Enforcement Agency (NESREA) and National Oil Spill Defection and Response Agency (NOSDRA) can foster government-

realized, the law should not be hidden from the people. It must be in the consciousness and awareness of the people". She identified ceaseless change in policies, lack of continuity and frequency change in leadership as the bane of effective environmental management.

Professor Fubara, therefore, challenged Nigerian to host the next annual global World Environment Day as part of efforts to boost effective Environmental Management in the country.

The Vice-Chancellor, Professor Oluwafemi Balogun in his Welcome Address read by the DVC (Academic) Professor Chryss Onwuka, made it known that the extent of compliance to environmental laws and regulations is not satisfactory saying there is need to assess the role of legislation vis-à-vis the relevance, review an enforcement to guarantee the sustainability of our environment.

The lecture which had in attendance Chief Odebiyi who chaired the occasion and other experts in Environmental Law and Environmental Management both within and outside the institution.

Omilola made the promise while delivering a Lecture titled "Poverty, Growth and the Performance of African Agriculture in an Era of Global Food and Financial Crises" at the Second AG Leventis Memorial Centre for Learning (LEMCEL) Lecture Series held at Julius Okojie Lecture Theatre 2.

The Guest Lecturer said his gesture was inspired by the rapid development he saw on Campus as compared to his undergraduate days while driving to the venue of the Lecture.

Omilola stressed that based on the enviable transformation, it was imperative and expedient of him to compliment the good works of the present administration by assisting Ph.D students and adding

commercialized agriculture in order to meet hunger and poverty rate in the nearest future.

Dr. Omilola fondly referred to as "Limpopo" during his days as President of Students' Union Government of the 1998/1999 session in UNAAB gave an extensive talk on the relevance of agriculture in our society, the need to increase resource efficiency and manage adequately agricultural based funding available to us.

In what appears like a down-play to the captivated audience, Dr. Omilola vividly narrated the fall-out of Nigeria in the circle of countries which met the MDG 1 standard.

He however noted that all hopes are not yet lost for the country in turning around its status, stating that with an increase in the Agricultural GDP, and proper utilization of resources by those at the helm of affairs, Nigeria will have a turn-around.

he Director, AG Leventis Memorial Centre for Learning (LEMCEL), Prof. Lateef Oladimeji Sanni has reiterated the Centre's commitment to re-orientate investors and industrialists on viable technological discoveries, innovations and good practices.

Prof. Sanni gave this assurance during his opening remarks at the Second LEMCEL Annual Lecture held at the Julius Okojie Lecture Theatre 2, UNAAB.

According to Prof. Sanni, the aim of the investors and industrialists' re-orientation is to promote sustain-

able agricultural and industrial growth through networking, Workshops, Seminars and trainings.

The Director, who thanked the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Oluwafemi Olaiya Balogun for contributing immensely to the development of LEMCEL, seized the opportunity to list parts of externally funded partnerships, which LEMCEL has been operating.

Among the externally funded projects named includes: "Cassava: Adding Value for Africa (C:AVA) Project", sponsored by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. "Partnership for Regional Developers' Initiative" with Sierra Leone, Benin Republic and Nigeria, sponsored by Africa Association of Universities (AAU), Accra, Ghana and DFID, UK.

Others are, establishment of Food Science and Nutrition Network for Poverty Reduction and Sustainable Rural Livelihood in West Africa (FOSNUT), which project inspection has been fixed for 25 to 26 June 2010 at UNAAB, also sponsored by the AAU and DFID.

The EU – ACP project on Science and Technology for Enhancing the Contribution of Tropical Root Crops to Development in ACP countries, with three years duration from November 2009 – October 2012.

The project partners are, natural Resources Institutes, University of Greenwich, UK as well as institutions from Nigeria, Uganda, The Caribbean, Zambia, St. Vincent and the Grenadines.
