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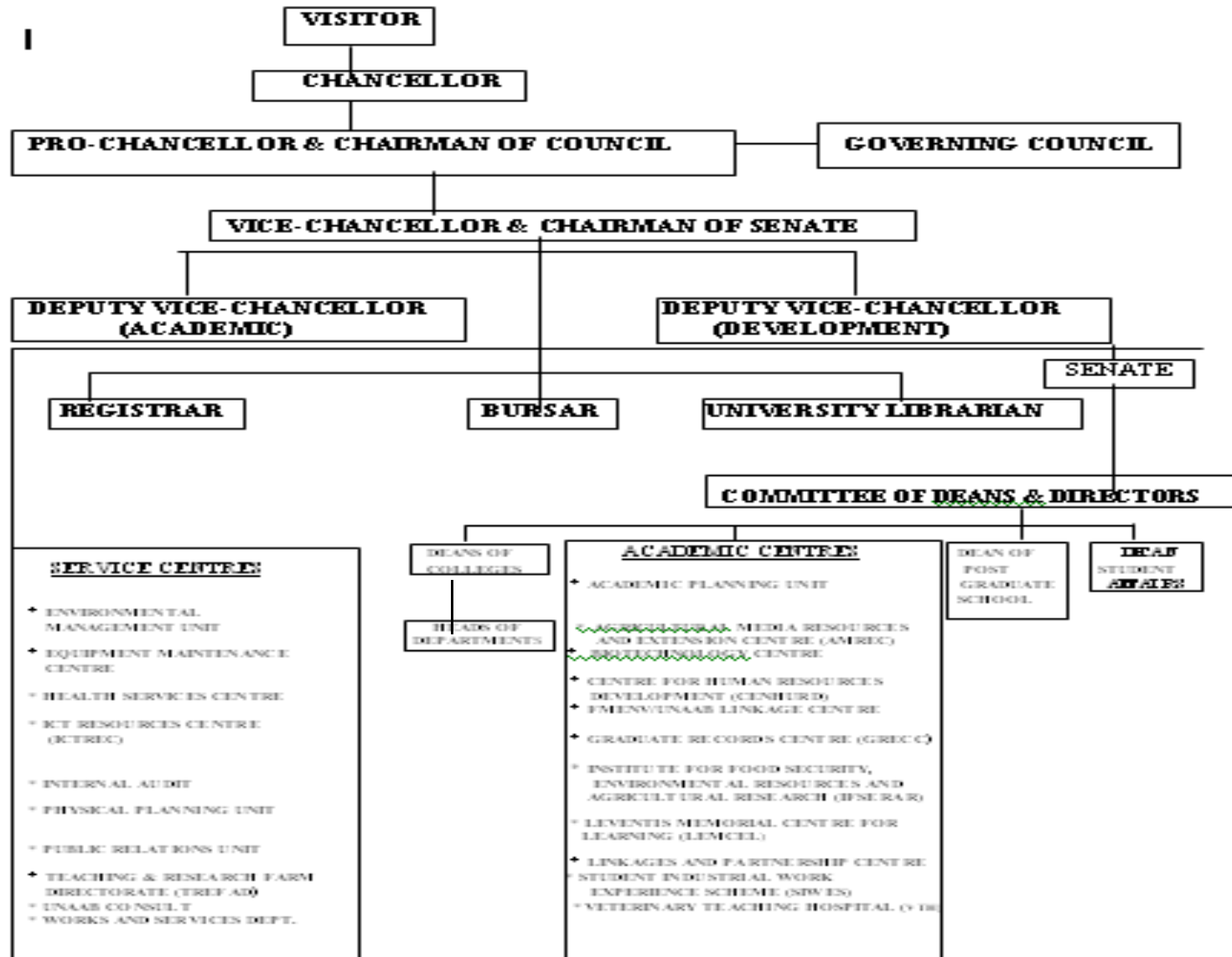
BRIEF HISTORY

- ❖ **College of Food Science and Human Ecology (COLFHEC)**

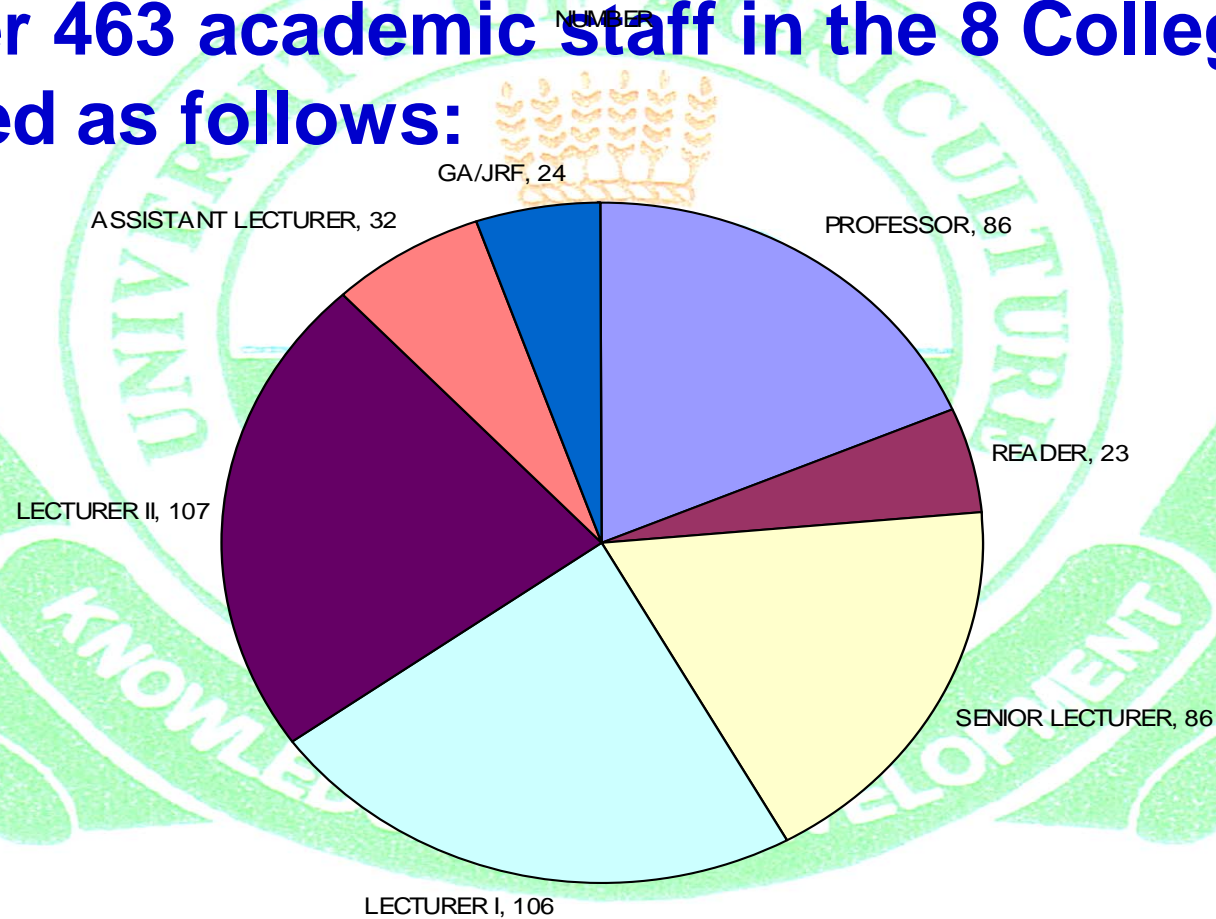
We now have eight (8) Colleges and 40 Departments with a total student population of 9, 446.

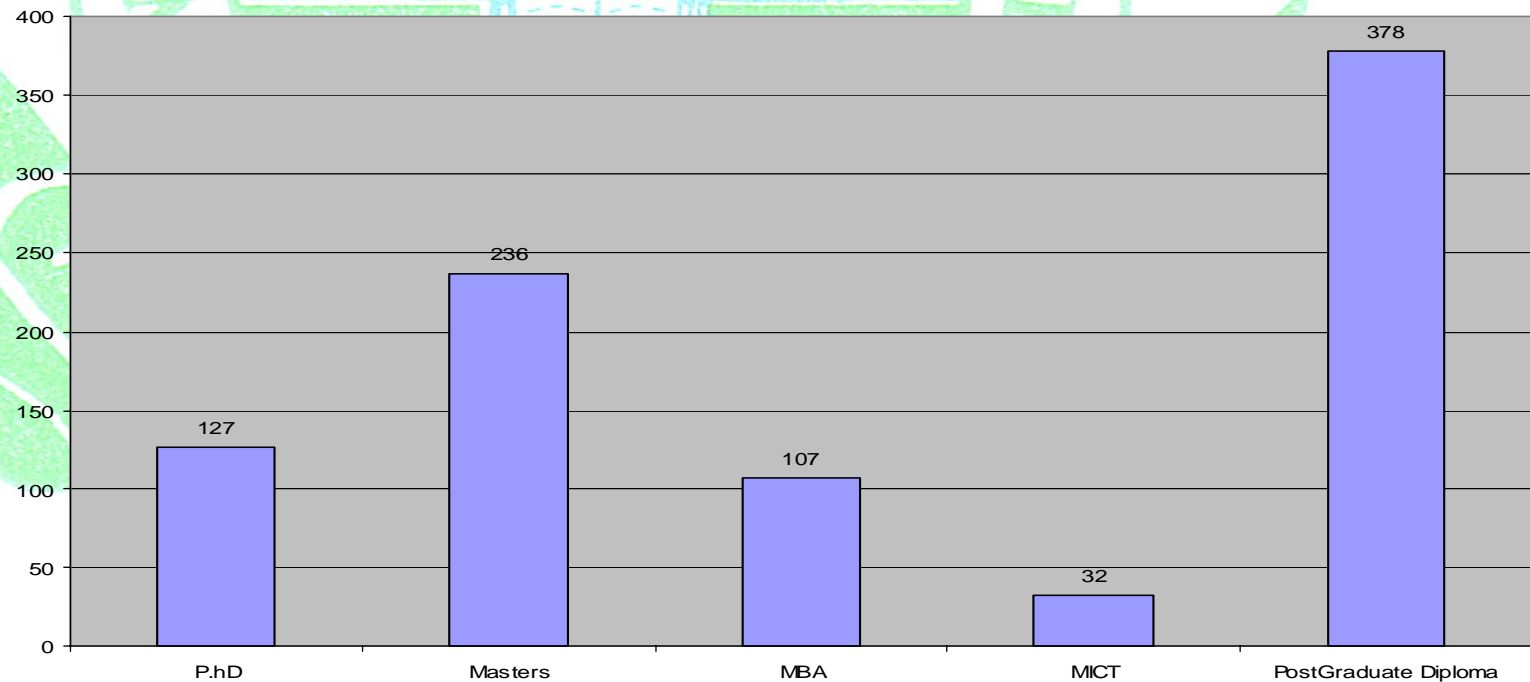

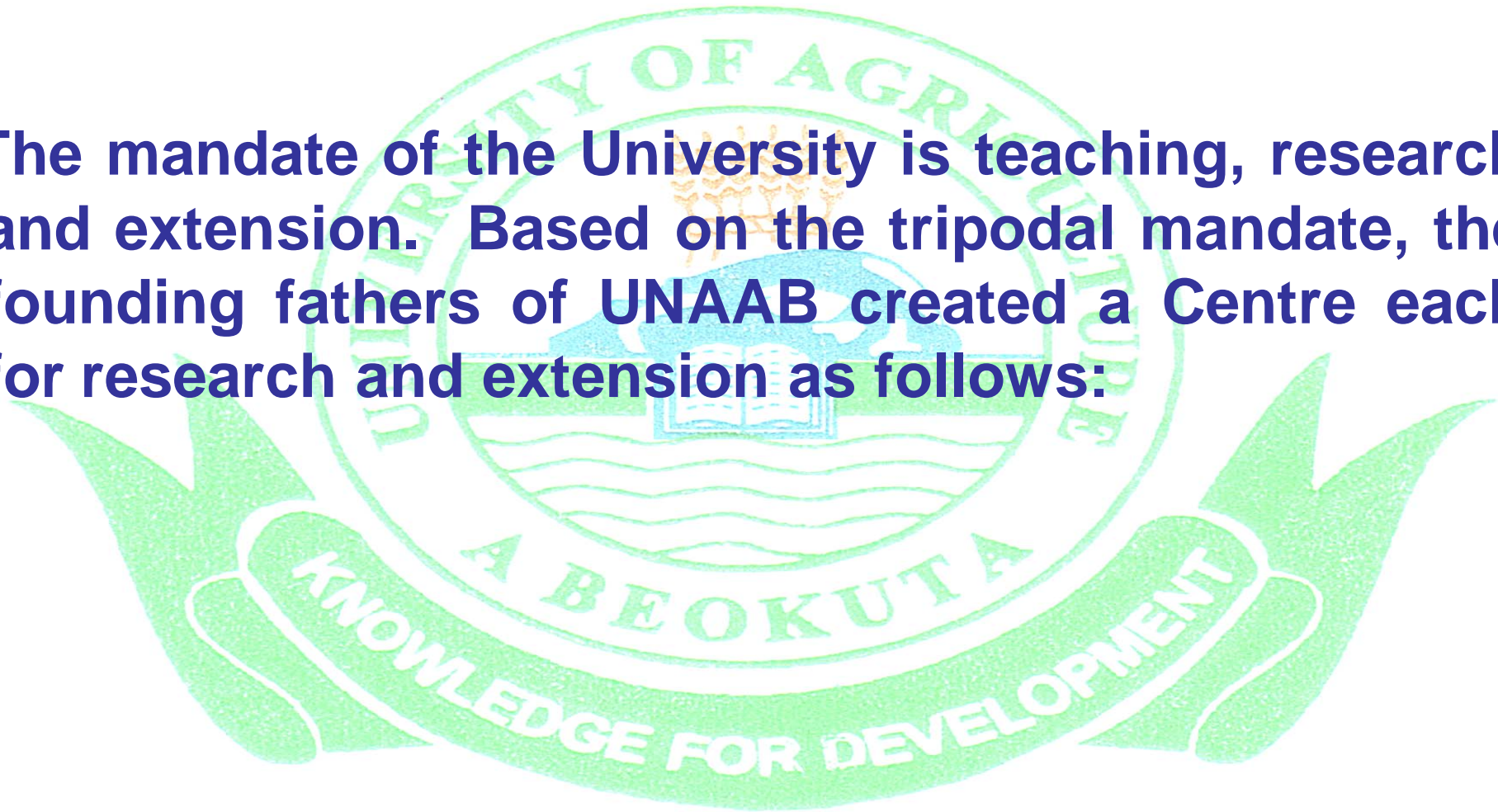




UNIVERSITY'S MANDATE

INSTITUTE OF FOOD SECURITY, ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH (IFSERAR)



- **Research and Development Centre (RESDEC) was established in 1990 committed to being the synergy and moving force of research in the University.**
- **In 2009, RESDEC transformed into IFSERAR with a vision to be the foremost Research Institute working towards the sustainable attainment of food security in Nigeria.**



INSTITUTE OF FOOD SECURITY, ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH (IFSERAR)



IFSERAR is structured into 8 Research programmes for the efficient, effective and sustainable conduct and management of research activities, focused on priority research for national development in line with the University's research mandates, as follows:

REGISTRY



The Registrar, as the head of Registry, is the Chief Administrative Officer of the University, directly responsible to the Vice-Chancellor. He is the Secretary to Council, Senate, Congregation and Convocation.

BURSARY



- ❖ Bursary department head is the Bursar.
- ❖ Chief Financial Officer
- ❖ Responsible to the Vice-Chancellor for the day-to-day administration and control of the financial affairs of the University.

The Bursary Department is made up of :

- ❖ The Treasury Division,
- ❖ The Expenditure Control Division,
- ❖ The Final Accounts and Statistics Division
- ❖ The Investment and Insurance Division with 64 professional staff.



'NIMBE ADEDIPE LIBRARY



The Library is named after the foundation Vice Chancellor of the University, Professor Nurudeen Olorun-Nimbe Adedipe.

- Presently has 45,000 volumes of books and monographs
- 5000 volumes of bound journals.
- Subscribes to 185 foreign and local journals in both electronic and print formats.
- Centrally located and features a 24-hour reading room that can accommodate 100 users.
- Total seating capacity for 600 users at a time.
- Offers services like References, Serials, Bibliographic, Home Borrowing, etc.



UNIVERSITY HEALTH CENTRE



The University Health Services department is in charge of rendering health care services to the university student (full time and part time) and staff members, including their dependants.

- Operates 24/7
- Drugs are given free to students while staff and dependants registered under the National Health Insurance Scheme (NHIS) only pay 10% of drug cost on each visit.
- Has NHIS accreditation for primary care consultation and secondary level accreditation for both pharmacy and laboratory services.



ACADEMIC PLANNING UNIT



- Established in line with the recommendation of the NUC to coordinate and streamline the academic policies and activities of the University.
- Handle the collation and management of data and information.
- Coordinates the processes leading to the accreditation of University programmes
- Recently got Senate approval for a quality assurance section to enhance the quality of course delivery for efficient output and employability of our graduates.



PHYSICAL PLANNING UNIT



The Unit coordinates the physical development of the University.

The mandate and activities of the Unit:

- Management of all capital projects of the University
- Management of the University land and space
- Implementation of the University Master Plan
- Acting as intermediary/liaison between the University and Development Agencies
- Serving as professional adviser on all projects from planning to commissioning stage
- Representation in all committees that are related to physical planning and development



WORKS AND SERVICES DEPARTMENT



- ❖ Established at the inception of the University and charged with the planning, design, organization and implementation of maintenance and rehabilitation works as related to civil, mechanical and electrical facilities in the University.
- ❖ Rehabilitation projects are carried out either by contract or direct labour.
- ❖ Responsible for the preparation of all necessary documents on rehabilitation projects and supervise works.
- ❖ Involved in the operation of facilities for the supply of essential services.



STUDENT AFFAIRS DIVISION



The Student Affairs Division oversees the welfare of all students of the University. It ensures peace and harmony on the campus by focusing mainly on student welfare, student union activities and hostel & management issues. It also coordinate student sporting activities.



INTERNAL AUDIT



The Internal Audit Unit which is headed by a Director is in the Vice-Chancellor's office, is concerned mainly with maintaining the implementation of an effective internal control, risk management and corporate governance of the University.

It has two units for effective and efficient service delivery, namely:

- Expenditure Control/Price Monitoring
- Treasury and Cash Office Operations



ICT RESOURCE CENTRE



The ICT Resource Centre is at the centre of the tripartite mandate of the University in facilitating information collection, analysis and communication for teaching, research, extension and University administration.

- ❑ The Centre handles the production of identity cards and responds regularly to requests for student and staff records on regular and routine basis.
- ❑ It is responsible for generating lists of registered students, reports on JAMB handling of hard and soft copies of various reports for the administration apart from being the centre of activities connected with scheduling of examinations and the class timetable on behalf of TIMTEC.



ICT RESOURCE CENTRE



Recent landmark achievements of the centre :

- ❑ Campus wide and sectoral wireless deployment across campus , Pension House and UNIS
- ❑ Creation of a totally new and an entire UNAAB Bursary network (March – April 2010)
- ❑ Configuration and deployment of e-Library (using e-Granary, LanTeal and Agora Servers)
- ❑ Created noteworthy and noticeable changes in UNAAB global web presence among other achievements.



BIOTECHNOLOGY CENTRE



- ❑ Staff , Postgraduate and Undergraduate students are encouraged to conduct their biotechnology related research work at the Center's Central Laboratory.
- ❑ The Centre focuses on four major areas of research and training that include:
 - Animal Biotechnology
 - Plant Biotechnology
 - Food Biotechnology
 - Bioinformatics
- ❑ On regular basis, training courses are organized and held at the Centre on biotechnology topics which attracted a number of world class biotechnology experts to UNAAB to assist as resource personnel.



PUBLIC RELATIONS



- Upgraded into a Directorate in 2008, under the current administration of the incumbent led by the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Oluwafemi Olaiya Balogun.
- The Directorate is basically responsible for the establishment and sustenance of mutual understanding between the University and its publics.

VETERINARY TEACHING HOSPITAL



- ✿ Established , May 2005
- ✿ To render specialized veterinary clinical and diagnostic services to the livestock, agro-allied and public health sectors of the Nigerian economy.
- ✿ To provides manpower capacity building in the various sub-disciplines of Veterinary science, at under and post-graduate levels.
- ✿ At present, the VTH carries out its activities from the Isale-Igbein Mini-campus of the University.



GRADUATE RECORDS AND CAREER CENTRE



Created in February 2007, in response to and in compliance with the express demand of the Federal Ministry of Education (FME) in Abuja. The Centre, through the utilization of improved information and communication technology, is aimed at:

- ❖ **Sourcing for relevant information that would be of immense benefit to both staff and students**
- ❖ **Empowering students to identify career objectives and discover unique talents and gifts**
- ❖ **Maintaining a life-long relationship between the University and her products through active Alumni Network.**



STUDENT INDUSTRIAL WORK EXPERIENCE SCHEME (SIWES)



- Designed to prepare and expose students of the University to the industrial work situation they are likely to meet after graduation.
- The scheme is funded by the Federal Government of Nigeria and jointly coordinated by the National Universities Commission (NUC) and Industrial Training Fund (ITF).
- The Unit was upgraded to a Directorate in the Vice-Chancellor's Office in August 2001. This was to enable the Unit cope with greater challenges of SIWES operations.



FMENV/UNAAB LINKAGE CENTRE



- ❑ Established in 1995 as FEPA/UNAAB Linkage Centre following the signing of a linkage agreement between FEPA and UNAAB.
- ❑ The centre is to serve as the Biodiversity Centre for forests, conservation and implementation of the Biodiversity convention, and also to assist the FMENV in training and research in relevant areas.
- ❑ The Centre hosts an Annual Lecture to commemorate the World Environmental Day.



AG LEVENTIS MEMORIAL CENTRE FOR LEARNING



- Bequeathed and commissioned to the University in 2003.
- It consists of Cybercafe section, Library section, AG Leventis Museum section, African Print and Art School section.
- The Centre is committed to re-orientate investors and industrialists on viable technological discoveries, innovations and good practices to promote Nigerian agriculture and industrial growth through networking, workshops, seminars and trainings.

- ❑ The 1st Annual Career Day was organized by the AG Leventis Memorial Centre for Learning of the University of Agriculture (LEMCEL) the programme took place on 18th March, 2009

THE TEACHING AND RESEARCH FARM



- ❑ Teaching and Research Farms Directorate (TREFAD) was Established to promote agricultural education and services for agricultural development.
- ❑ The University Farms to be managed by the Directorate will be designed and run as a model agricultural outfit, a centre of excellence and a leading one amongst those of other Universities in the country and elsewhere.
- ❑ TREFAD is a service and production unit. It will establish model demonstration farms and facilities for all areas of farming activities covered in the University curriculum.



EQUIPMENT MAINTENANCE CENTRE



- ❖ The Equipment Maintenance Centre came to existence in 1989.
- ❖ The Equipment Maintenance Centre was set up to ensure that maintenance culture is imbibed by ALL in order to guarantee the functionality and reliability of all laboratory equipment for much longer period than it has been in the past.
- ❖ The Centre is in the office of the Vice-Chancellor, and headed by a Director, who is a Professional Technologist. The Centre is housed in the Central Laboratory/Biotechnology Building.



ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT UNIT



- The EMU is in charge of maintaining the cleanliness of the University environment.
- The Unit also carries out routine or periodical control of termites and bees, clearing of felled trees and fumigation of buildings.
- The Unit is also saddled with the responsibility of keeping the lawns of other University buildings in town such as LEMCEL, VC's Lodge etc. and the soft landscaping of CENHURD Village, where work is on-going.



ENVIRONMENTAL UNIT



- ❑ The Environmental Unit was formerly called Security Unit. It is renamed Environmental Unit in 2007 to reflect its true responsibilities of maintaining the security and safety of life and property of UNAAB Community.
- ❑ The Unit is therefore the security and safety unit of this University, and thus it is responsible for crime prevention, fire prevention, motor accident prevention, crimes and accidents occurrences investigation and other security and safety problems management in this campus.
- ❑ The unit has 123 internal staff and 100 external staff (Sheriff Deputies).



CENTRE FOR HUMAN RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT



Established in November, 2002. The objectives of the Centre are:

- ❖ To facilitate educational development in the immediate community by providing quality academic programmes for qualified candidates.
- ❖ To generate revenue for the University without jeopardizing the quality of service to the community.

CENHURD has 4 programmes as follows:

Pre-Degree : The Pre-degree programme is a full-time pre-matriculation training, designed to prepare students with good “O” level results for various degree programmes of the University.



CENTRE FOR HUMAN RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT



Foundation Science: It was designed to prepare students for various courses within the university via a pre-matriculation full time programme for two sections

Part-time Degree: The programme is designed to meet the academic needs of candidates who cannot be accommodated in the full-time programmes of the University

ICT: The programme was established to provide practical ICT training that will enhance the IT capabilities of participants



UNAAB CONSULT LTD.



UNAAB Consult Ltd (UCL) is the arm of the University with a vision to promote development through the provision of consultancy services and direct involvement in development-oriented interventions in rural and urban areas in Nigeria and other developing economies.

UCL works with an assemblage of top flight academics from all the Departments and Units of the University, using up-to-date training materials, laboratories and tools and a congenial environment for research and training.



UNAAB CONSULT LTD.



The new UCL provides consultancy and technical services in the following areas:

- * Capacity building**
- * Geographic Information Services (GIS)**

In the last four months, UCL has responded to over twenty newspaper advertisements requesting for submission of proposals and bidding for studies with national and international organizations and agencies.



UNAAB STAFF SCHOOL



- UNAAB Staff School was established on 6th October 1997 to enable staff of the University send their children and wards to a Nursery and Primary School owned by the University, with the intention of giving them qualitative education.**
- The School, which is presently located in the Mini Campus at Isale-Igbein will move to its permanent site soon.**
- The School policy on enrolment into arm of a class is to have a minimum of 25 and maximum of 30 in each arm and it has a total population of 773 pupils in the current session.**



UNAAB INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL (UNIS)



- **The University of Agriculture, Abeokuta International School (UNIS) is the Secondary School founded by the University in September 2004 to provide a comprehensive secondary school education and mould characters of young boys and girls who would grow and stand-out tall among their peers in academics, commitment to duty, high moral values and service to the nation and mankind**
- **The school took off on Sunday 12th September, 2004 with 13 students The school enrolment in its second and third year is 72 , 120 respectively Current enrolment stands at 289, all in the boarding house.**
