DNA Fingerprint

The discovery of DNA fingerprinting has revolutionised criminal identification and forensic science. It involves isolation and making of images of sequences of DNA of individuals. Traditionally fingerprints have been used for identification purposes in this manner; it is a much more accurate way to determine identity and has proven to be the most scientifically valid procedure for human identification in forensic science. DNA fingerprints are unique to every individual and can be used as legal evidence in court to prosecute or defend alleged criminals, to identify or rule out persons as biological parents of a child and to identify organisms causing a disease. It could also be used for rapid quality analysis of food and pharmaceutical products. The workshop is essential in forensic sciences, biochemistry, microbiology, medicine, psychiatry, pathology, economics, crime detection, paternity dispute, industrial and agricultural quality control, veterinary sciences and human identification to mention a few.
