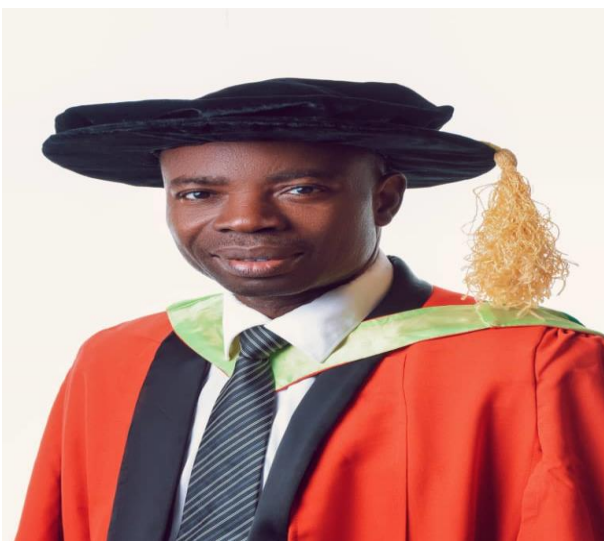


### **i. Biography**
