## **FROM THE VICE-CHANCELLOR'S DESK**

I am pleased to introduce the 2018 Annual Report, which illustrates the University's commitment to advancing excellence in education, research and scholarship. I am committed to building a University that creates new knowledge, disseminates knowledge and applies same for the benefit of mankind as well as create a conducive and serene environment for teaching and learning leading to turn-out of graduates who can measure up favourably with their counterparts from other universities, globally.

In the last fourteen (14) months, the University has made history in the areas of Research and Scholarship, among these were the award of the Certificate of Registration of the first Improved local Chicken Breed branded FUNAAB ALPHA by the National Centre for Genetic Resources and Biotechnology (NACGRAB), strengthening of relationship with World Bank-African Centre of Excellence, Restructuring of Centre for Excellence in Agricultural Development and Sustainable Environment (CEADESE), and Cassava Adding Value for Africa (CAVA), signing of Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the University and Institutions within and outside the country such as FUNAAB-AWARD (African Women in Agricultural Research and Development), and FUNAAB-UNIMAID (University of Maiduguri).

The University had a smooth Accreditation Exercise for eight programmes with full accreditation in line with the Bench Mark for Academic Standard (BMAS) of the National Universities Commission (NUC). The University has witnessed further growth and development in the areas of physical infrastructure, human capital and financial resources. Major projects were commissioned, including, the ultra-modern undergraduate twin-hostels (Male and Female Blocks) which would increase the number of students living on campus. Also, the CENTS Building, 750 Seater Science Laboratory Complex, Cassava Processing Facility and the 250-Seater Computer Facility as well as the renovation of Laboratories and Lecture Theatres while some others are on-going, one of which is the rehabilitation of the University's access road from Camp to campus gate. Some are at the commencement stages. These projects were made possible by TETFund allocation, capital grants from the Federal Government of Nigeria to the University in the year under review as well as National Resources Institute-European Union – Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation for Agricultural Development (NRI-EU-BMGF-IFAD) and World Bank Conference des Responsables de Recherche Agronomique Africains (CORAF) Upscaling the Nigerian Flash Drying Experience for Sustainable Regional Trade in West Africa – (UDESWA)

On staff welfare, our administration has strengthened the congenial atmosphere on campus and we have also enhanced harmonious working relationship with all the unions on campus in the last one year. The leaders of the various unions have imbibed dialogue and constructive engagement with the management which is a sign of commitment to placing the interest of the University above all other interests. The resultant effect is the high productivity of staff generally, hence the

large number of beneficiaries of the 2018 promotion exercise. An ample number of teaching and non-teaching staff have also benefited from local and overseas training programmes through TETFund intervention and other sources.

The University as a matter of policy has always held the welfare of the students in high esteem and without sounding immodest, the University has always been fortunate to have student leaders who are inclined toward responsible unionism and dialogue by aligning themselves with the mission and vision of the University. The physically-challenged students have not been left out, as their needs have always received priority to rekindle their hope and optimism.

As I always reiterate, there is no higher calling than serving God and humanity while we still live and I belong to the school of thought that believes that in serving humanity, we serve God. I would like to use this golden opportunity to once again appreciate the members of staff and students of this University for their unflinching support and commitment to the mission and vision of this administration. I enjoin all stakeholders to join me in making our University a great citadel of learning for the advancement of knowledge for development.

## CHAPTER 1

### 1.0 ACTIVITIES IN THE UNIVERSITY

#### 1.1 FUNAAB at 30



The University's Vice-Chancellor, Professor Kolawole Salako has appraised FUNAAB's Thirty Years of existence declaring that the institution has contributed to the transformation agenda of successive Federal Government, especially in the area of agriculture.

Professor Salako who disclosed this at a Press Conference commemorating the University 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebrations attributed FUNAAB's contributions to nation building to her unwavering commitment to setting and achieving unprecedented goals in academic and research activities.

He pointed out that in the years ahead of her 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary, the University won't relent in propelling the education sector and the nation in general to greater heights through mapping and implementation of lofty goals in academic and research activities.

According to him, the University is known throughout Africa as a leading champion of food security, environmental resources and agricultural research through its research engagement with national and international stakeholders, stressing that it is the lead implementing partner to Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation-sponsored project tagged "Cassava: Adding Value for Africa (CAVA2)" in Nigeria, Malawi, Uganda, Tanzania and Ghana in collaboration with her technical partners, NRI, UK and International Institute of Tropical Agriculture, Ibadan (IITA).

## 1.1 FUNAAB Matriculates 3,807 Students, Holds Commencement Lecture, Our new students are among the best – VC

The University has matriculated 3,807 students offered provisional admission with the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Kolawole Salako declaring that “our new students are among the best that can be admitted”. The Matriculation Ceremony which featured the University’s Sixth Commencement Lecture delivered by Mrs. Oluyemisi Iranloye, Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer of Psaltery International Limited, Ado-Awaye, Oyo State, was held at the University Ceremonial Building.

Mrs. Oluyemisi Iranloye delivered the University Sixth Commencement Lecture with a charge to the newly admitted students to imbibe five (5) mind-set attributes for a productive academic achievement.

According to her, they are the disciplined mind, the synthesizing mind, the creative mind, the respectful mind and the ethical mind. She assured the students that if they cultivated the mind-sets

aforementioned, “then you are on your way to becoming a great leader. It’s just a matter of time”. Earlier, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Salako disclosed the rationale behind the Commencement Lecture saying it was borne out of the genuine intention to inspire the students and to ignite and boost their confidence with the conviction that “Yes, You Can if You believe You Can”.

A total number of 11, 800 applicants chose FUNAAB as their most preferred institution, 6, 307 applicants were able to meet up with the 180 and 200 cut-off marks as applicable to their course of choice.

The University through the Admissions Committee was saddled with the responsibility of selecting and recommending the most qualified among the applicants. To assist the Committee in this regard, Post UTME Examination Exercise was conducted to select eligible candidates. The Exercise was carried out in two phases. The first POST-UTME Examination Exercise was held on Wednesday, October 4, 2017 while the second took place on Thursday, October 5, 2017. At the end of the exercise, a total number of three thousand, eight hundred (3,800) candidates were recommended for Admission.

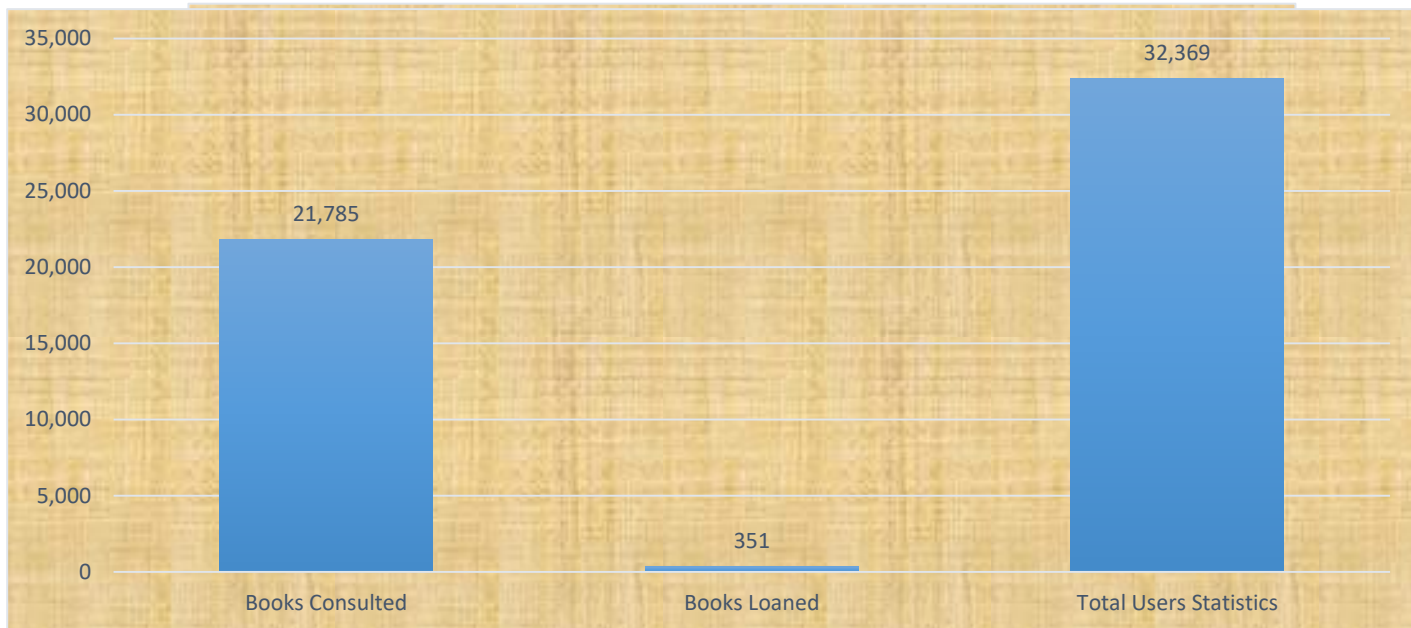

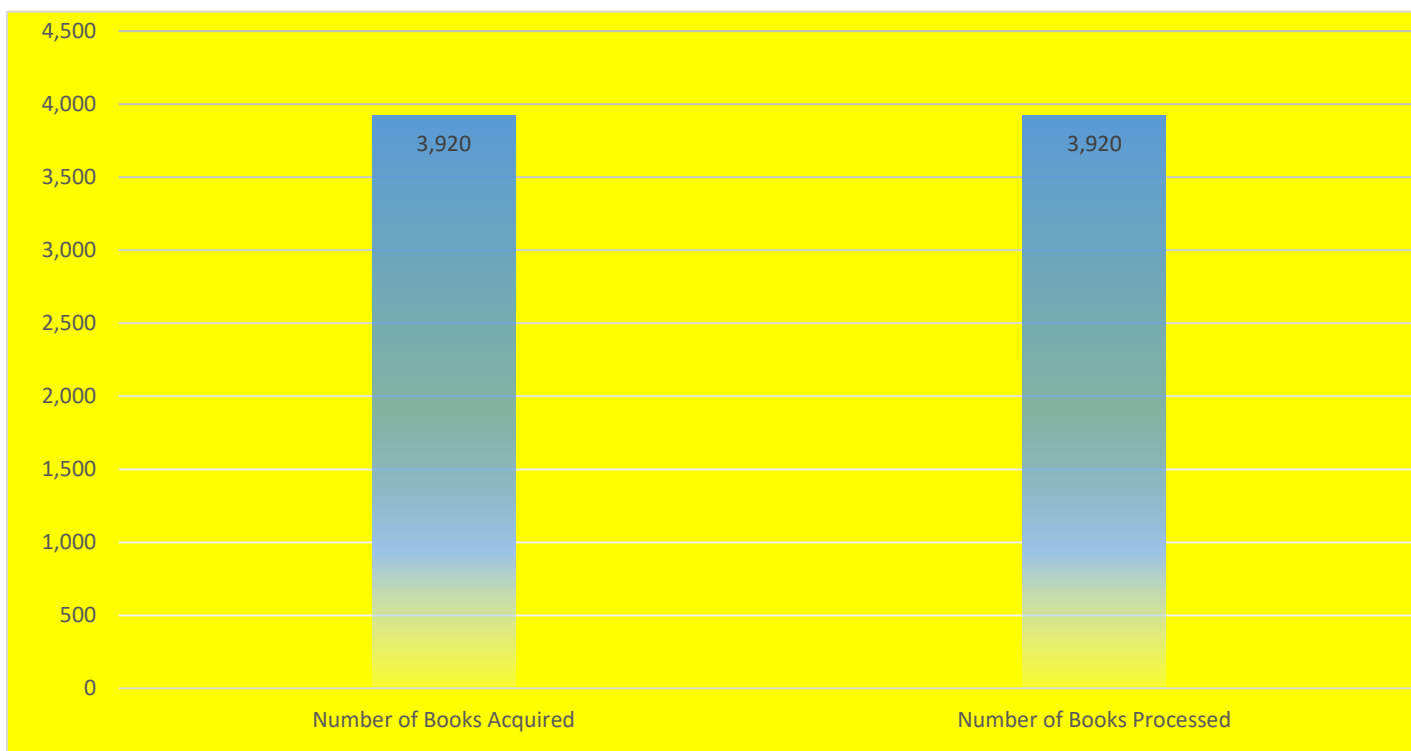

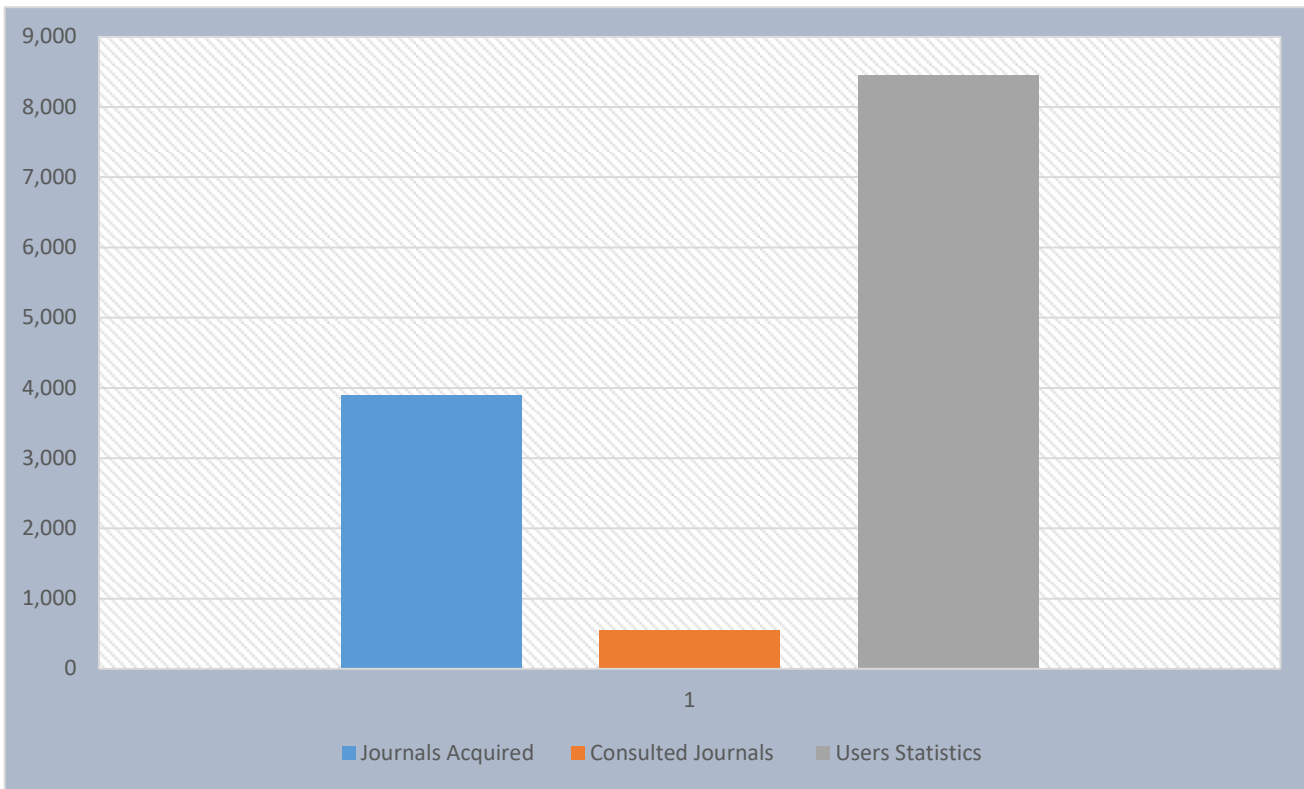


#### 3.3.2 Fig: 2017/2018 Academic Session for Books Acquired and Processed



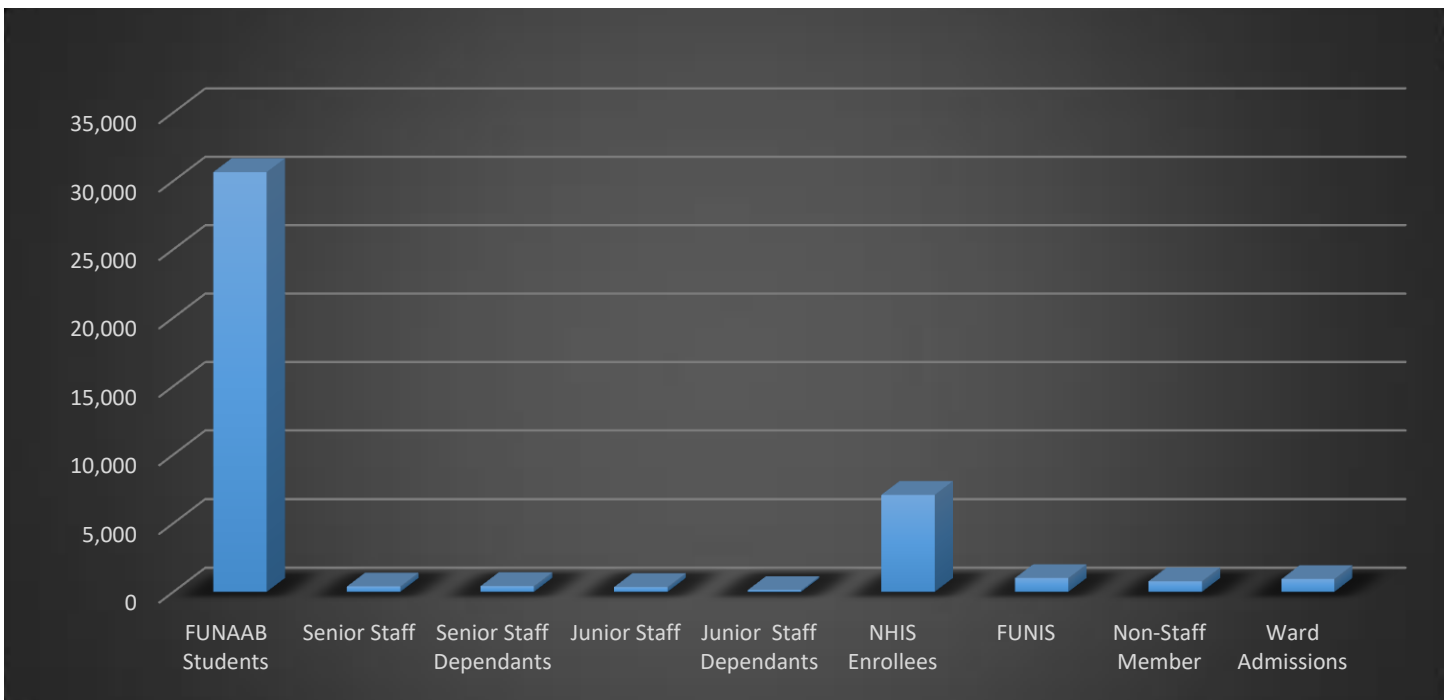


**Fig: 2017/2018 Academic Session Readers and Services Section**

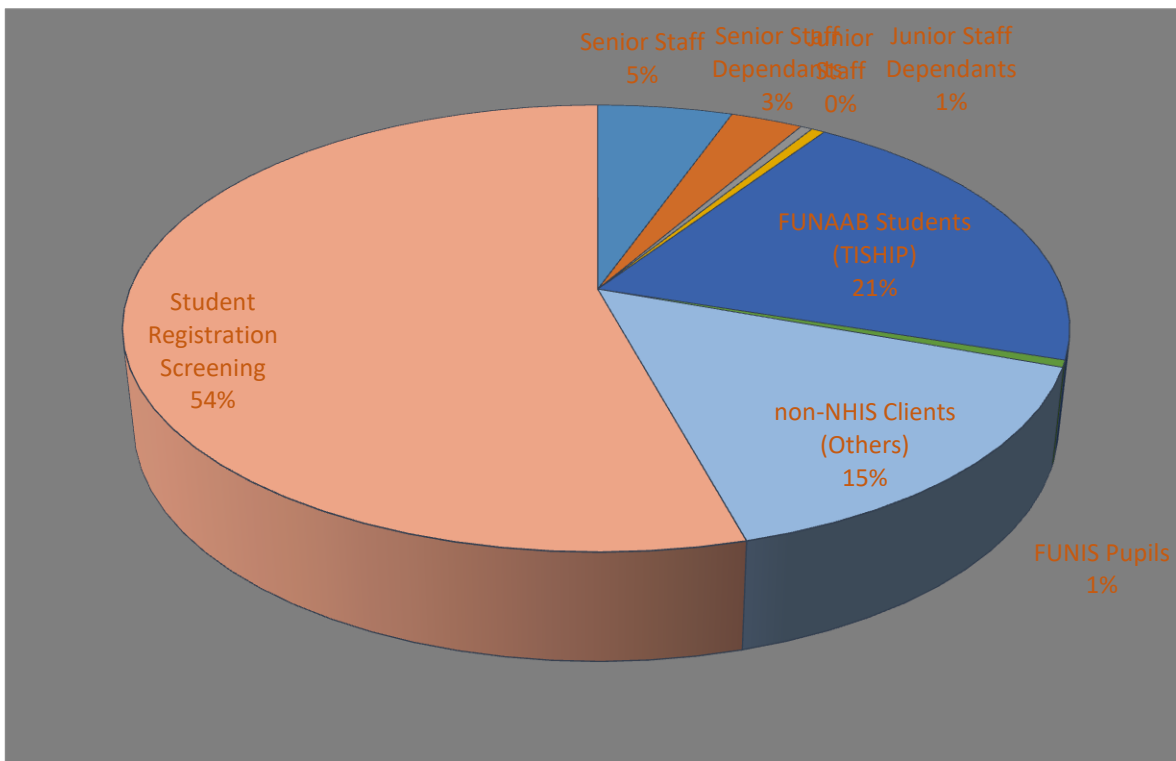

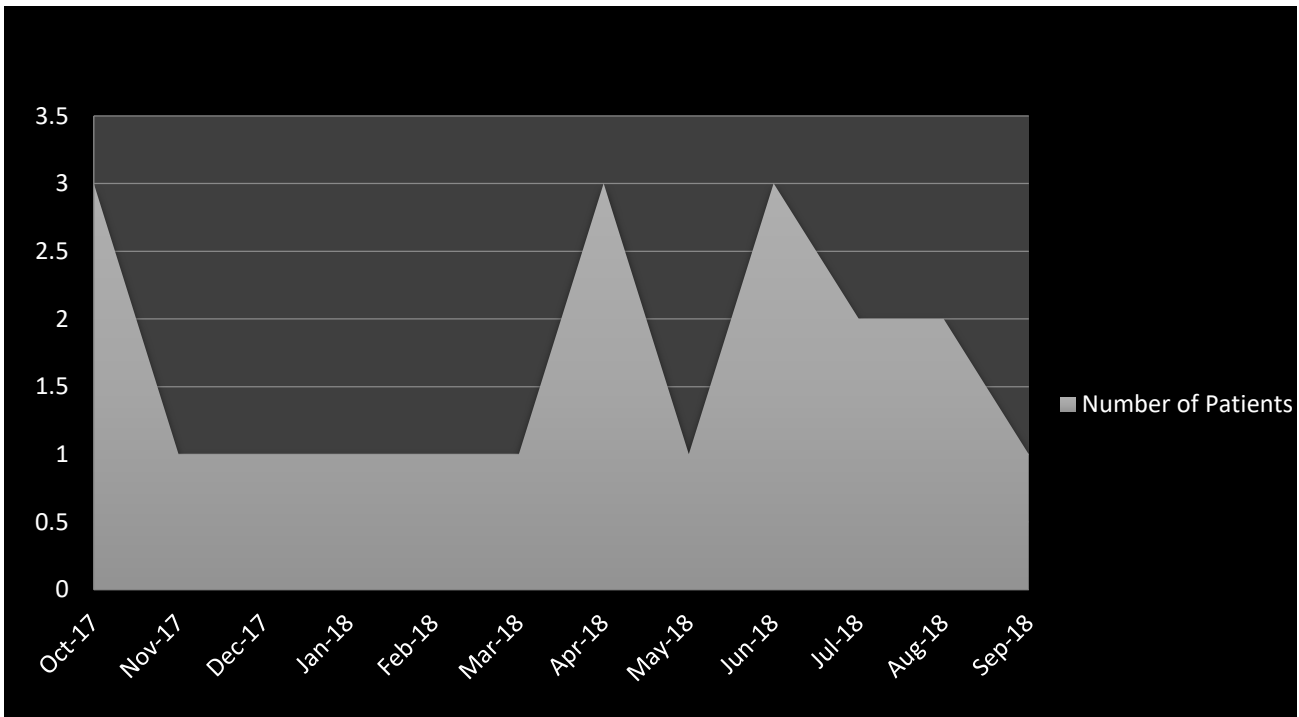
**Fig: 2017/2018 Academic Session Attendance at the Clinic**



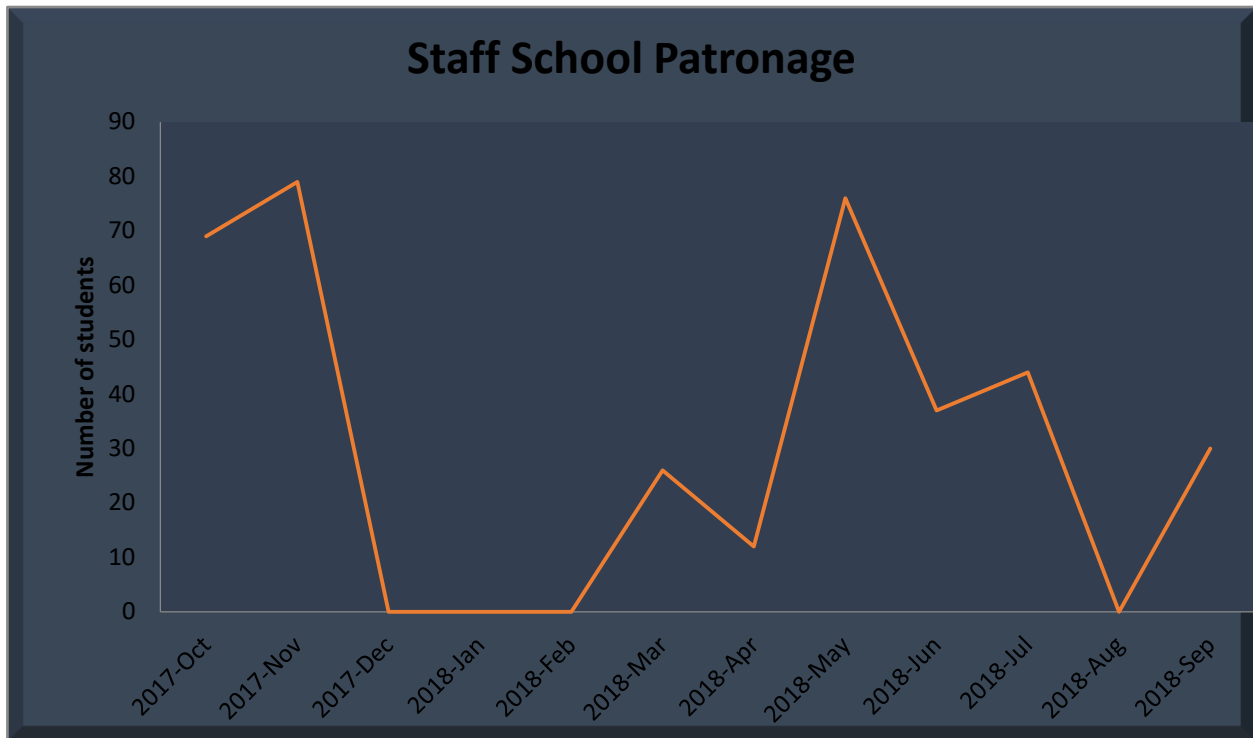
**Fig: 2017/2018 Academic Session Laboratory Tests**



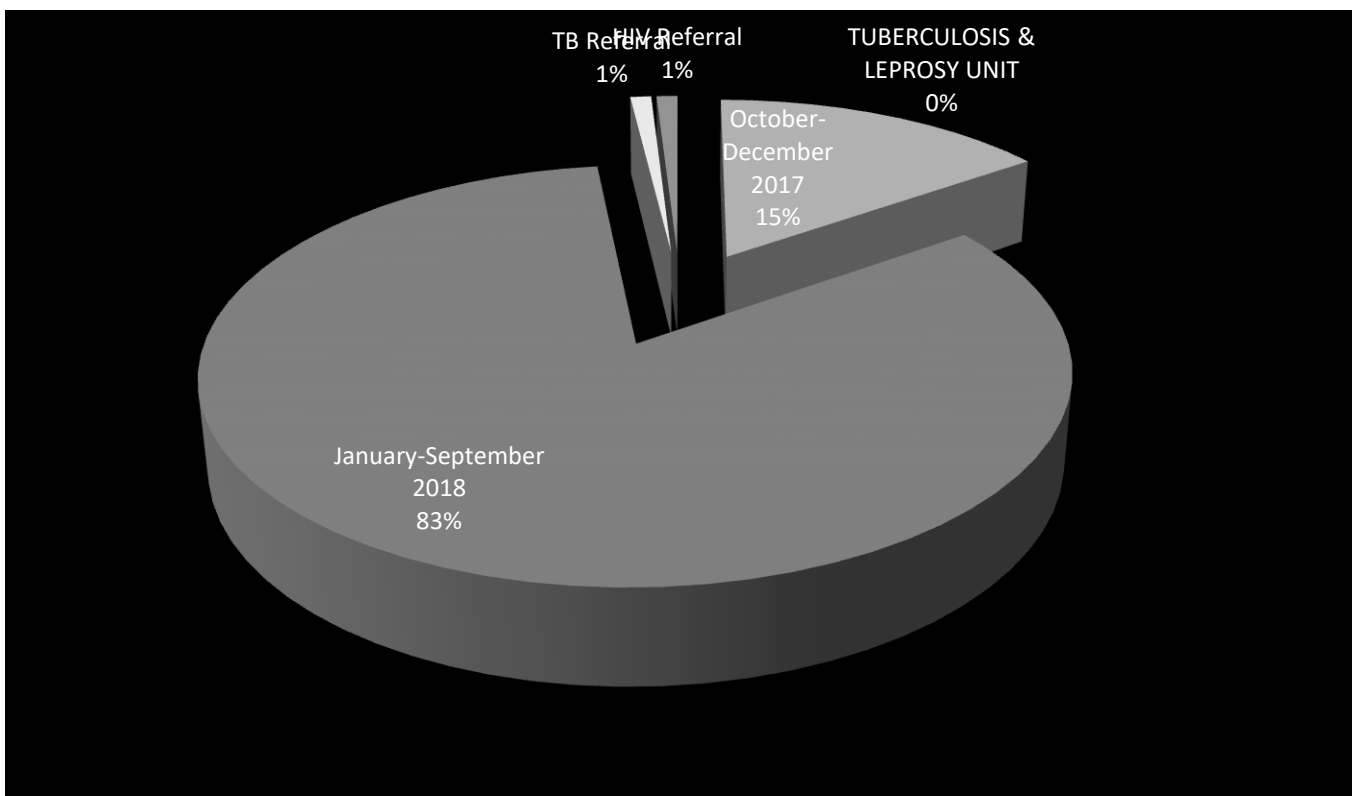
**Fig: 2017/2018 Family Planning**



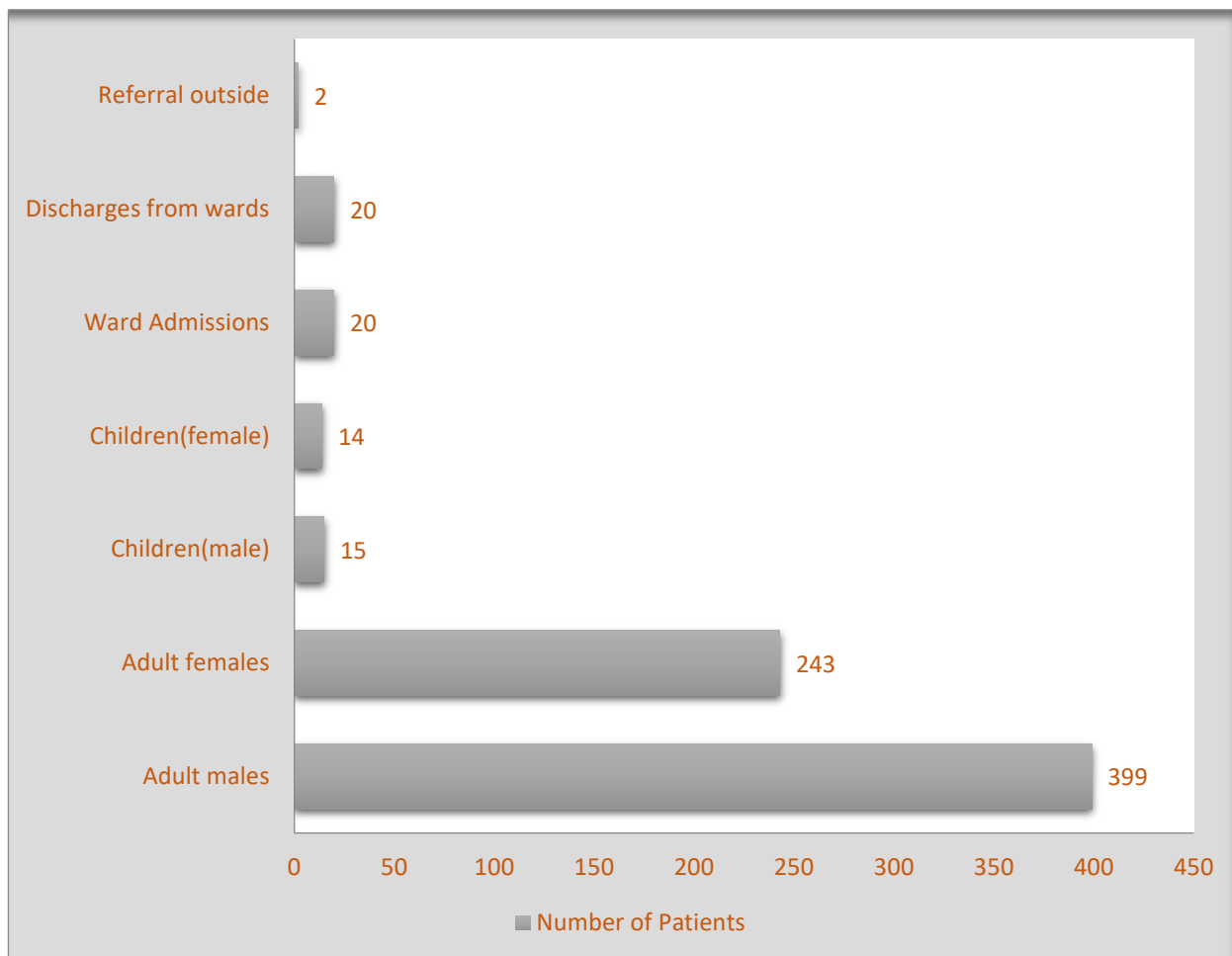
**Fig: 2017/2018 Academic session, University Staff School Patronage**



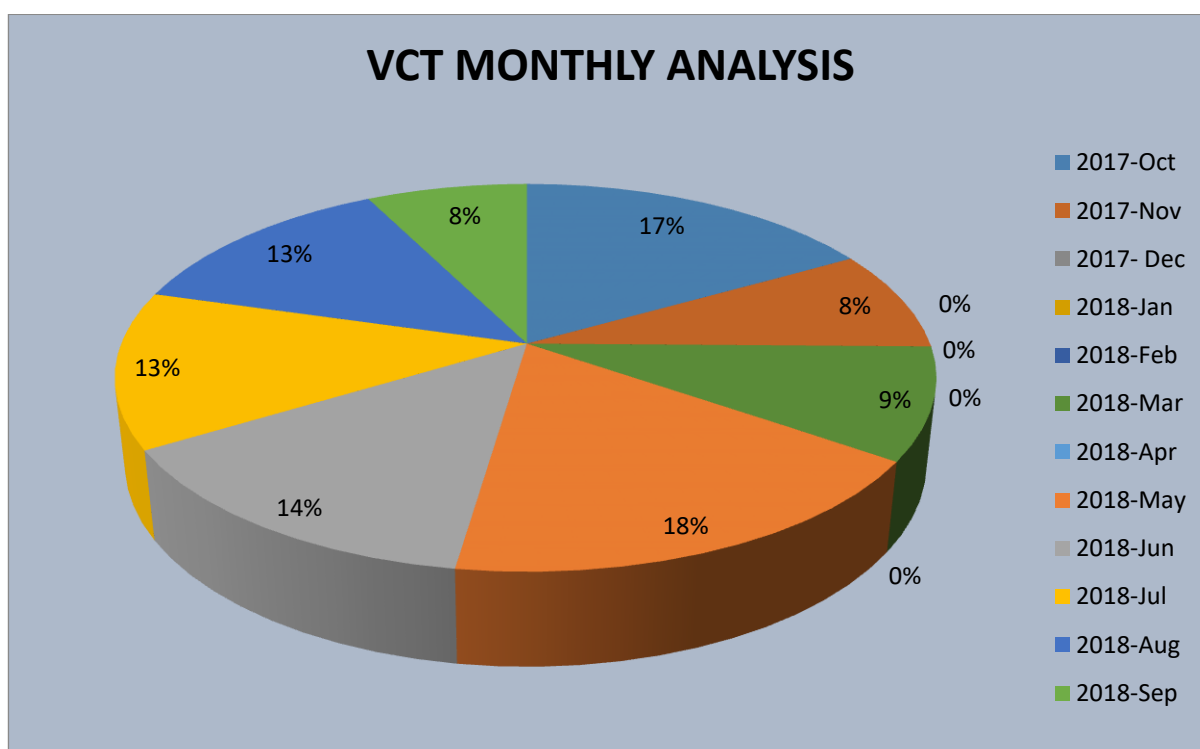
**Fig: Tuberculosis and Leprosy**

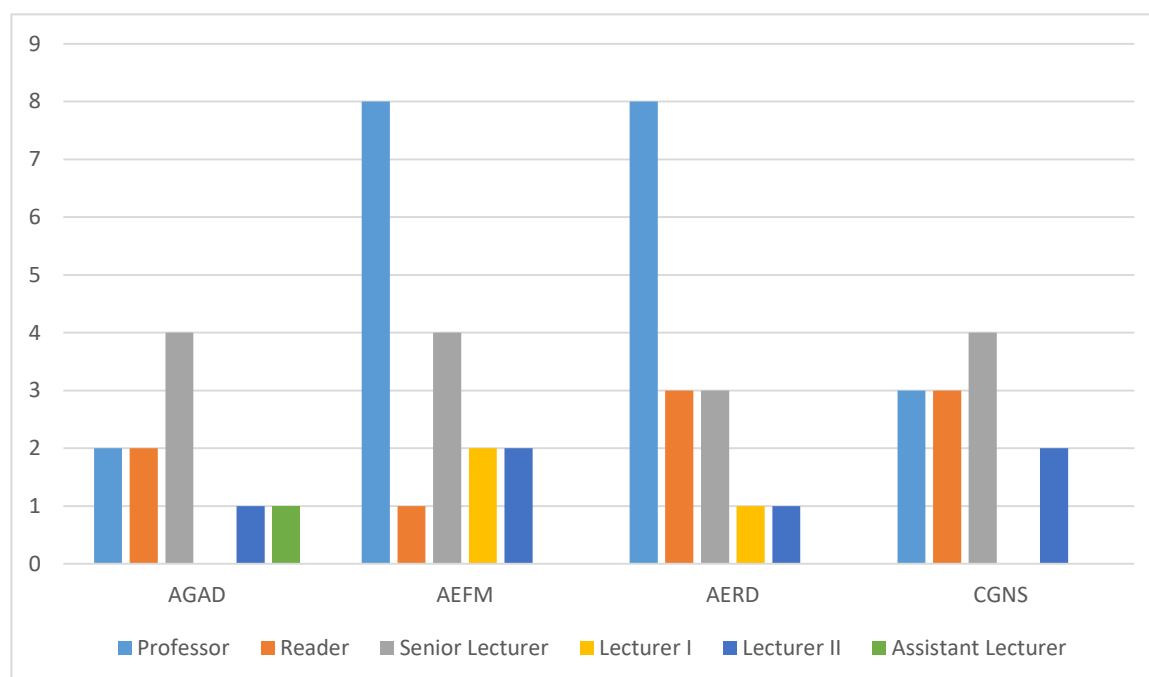

#### Overview of the College

The College Agricultural Management and Rural Development (COLAMRUD) started as College of Agricultural Management, Rural Development and Consumer Studies (COLAMRUCS) in 1988, was renamed COLAMRUD in 2009 when COLFHEC was carved out. The College is presently made up of four departments, namely: Department of Agricultural Administration (AGAD), Department of Agricultural Economics and Farm Management (AEFM), Department of Agricultural Extension and Rural Development (AERD) and Department of Communication and General Studies (CGNS). The College provides the training needed in agricultural economics, farm management, agricultural extension, rural development and agricultural administration.

One of the departments is also responsible for teaching of General Studies courses to all undergraduate students in the University

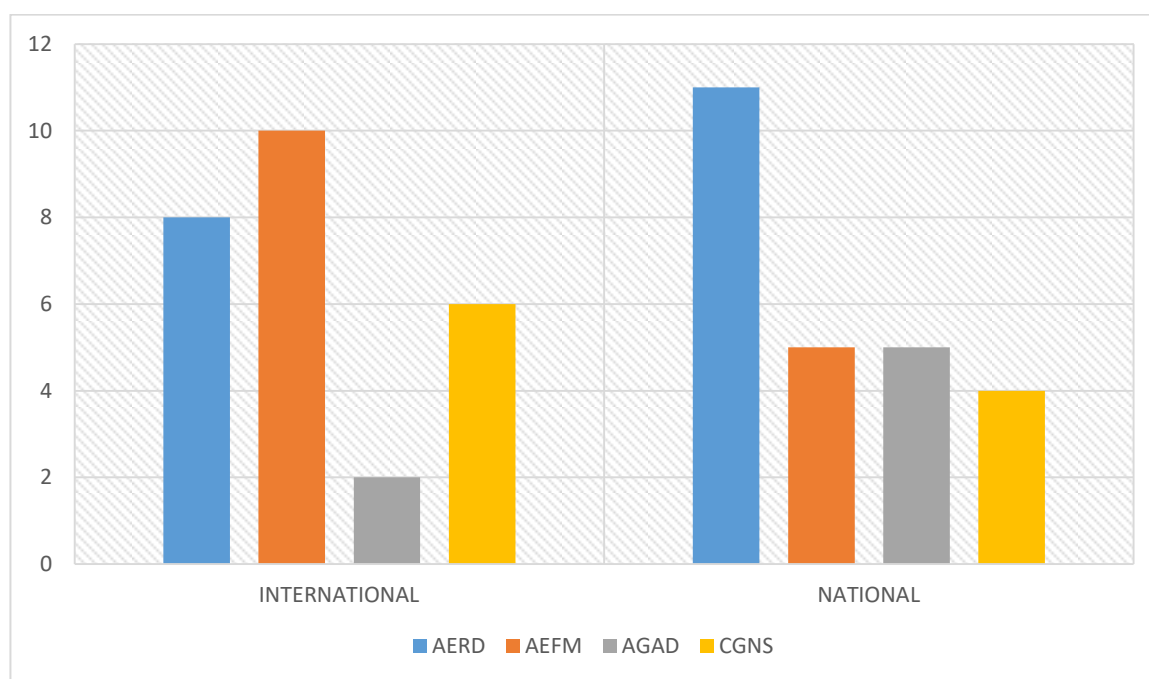

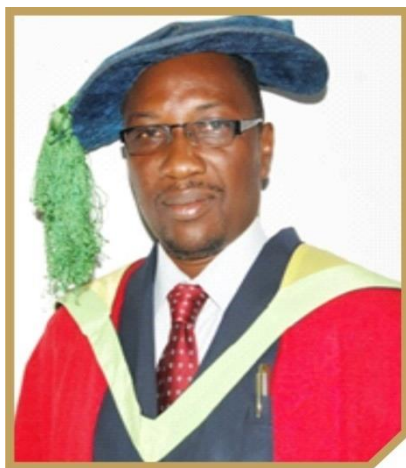

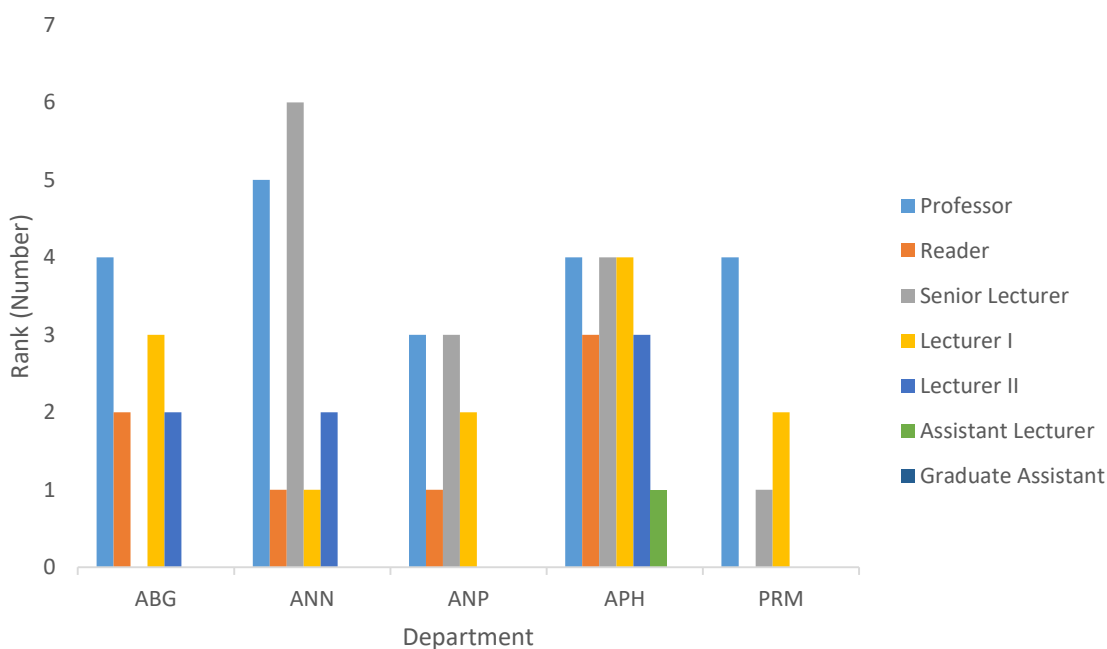

#### 4.3.1 OVERVIEW OF THE COLLEGE

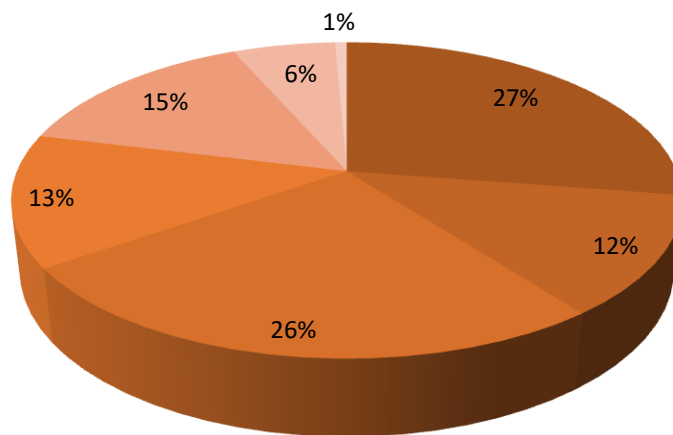
FIGURE 1: Academic Staff by Rank As At December 2018

The College of Animal Science and Livestock Production was established in 1988 out of the School of Technology of the old College of Science and Technology, Abeokuta and currently contributes to the B. Agric. programmes through its five Departments shown in Figure 1. The College has the highest assemblage of Registered Animal Scientists in the Nigerian University System and is recognised by the Nigerian Institute of Animal Science as a Centre of Excellence in Animal Breeding and Genetics. Activities of the Departments in the College include: teaching students at undergraduate and postgraduate levels, research and extension services. 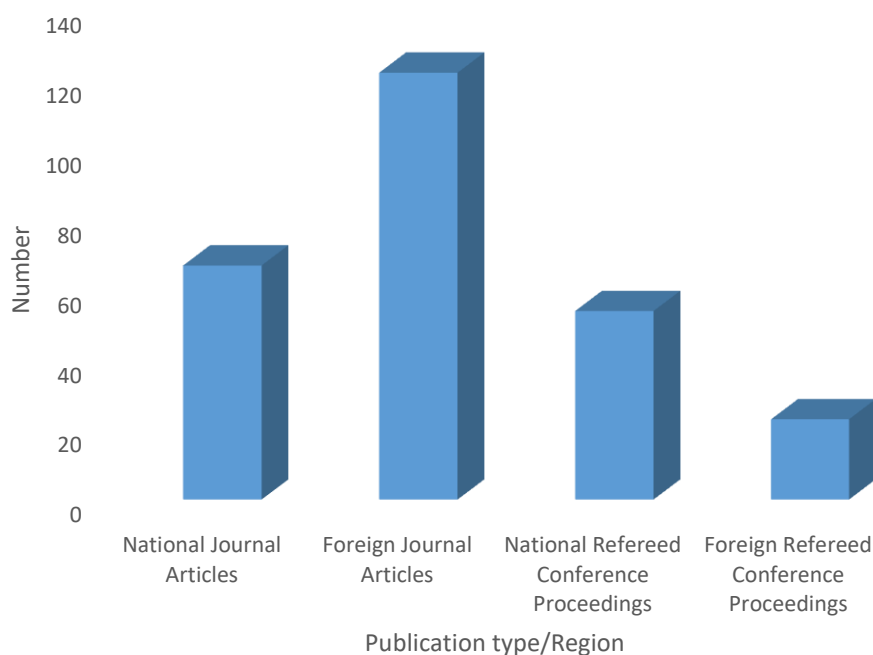

## Chemistry Hosts German Scholar, Eyes Research Collaboration

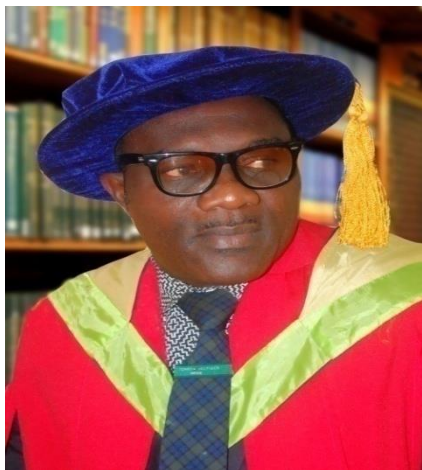

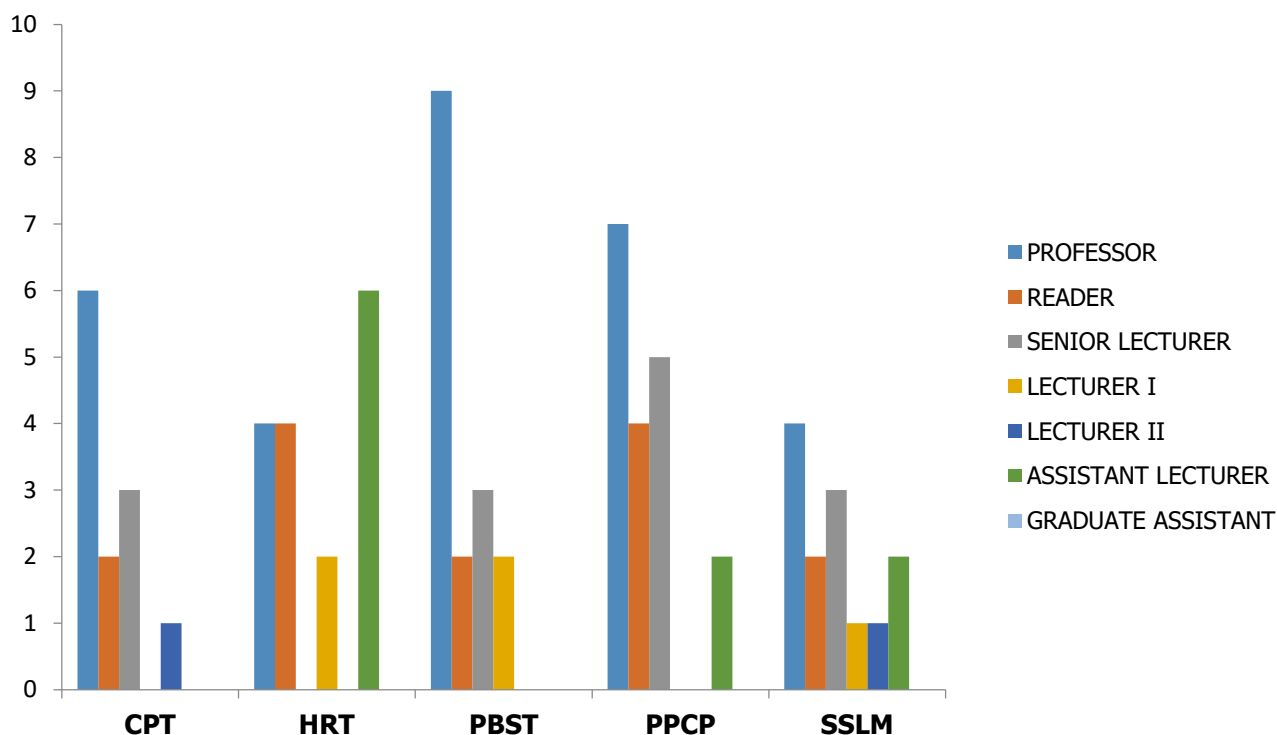

- (ii) to equip trainees with knowledge and skill for teaching, research and public service functions.

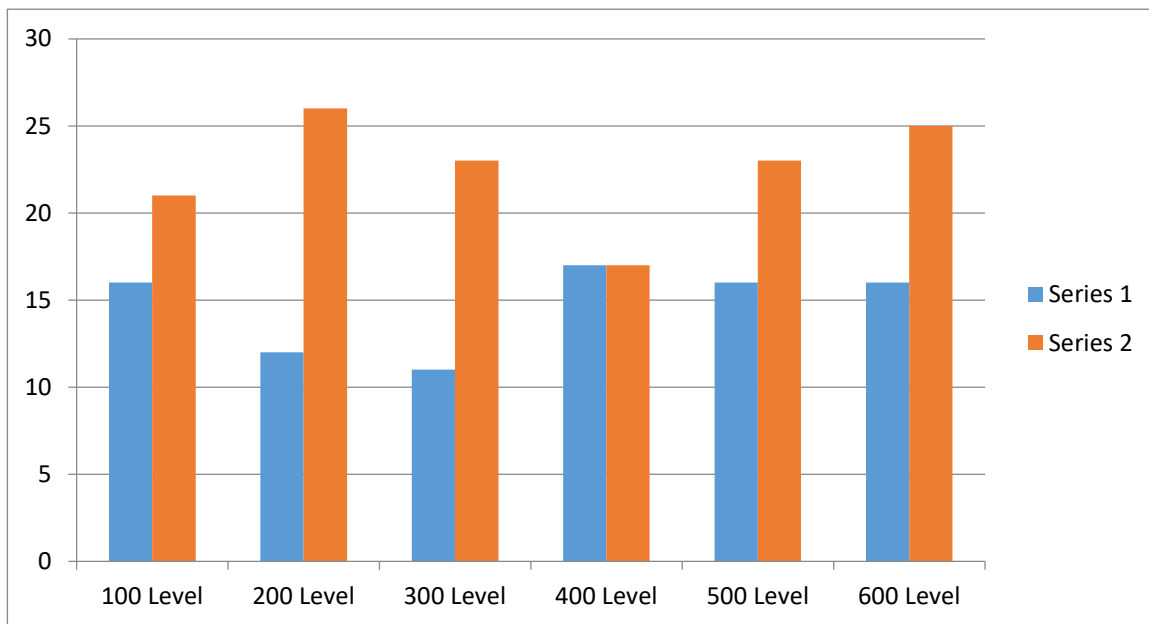

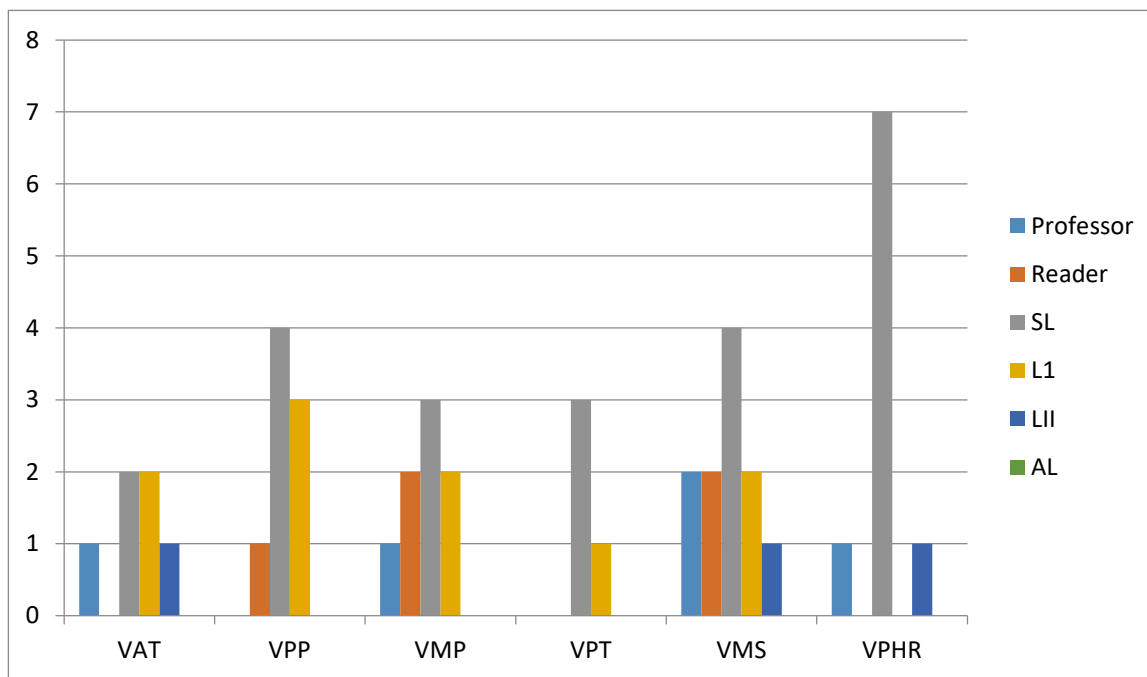

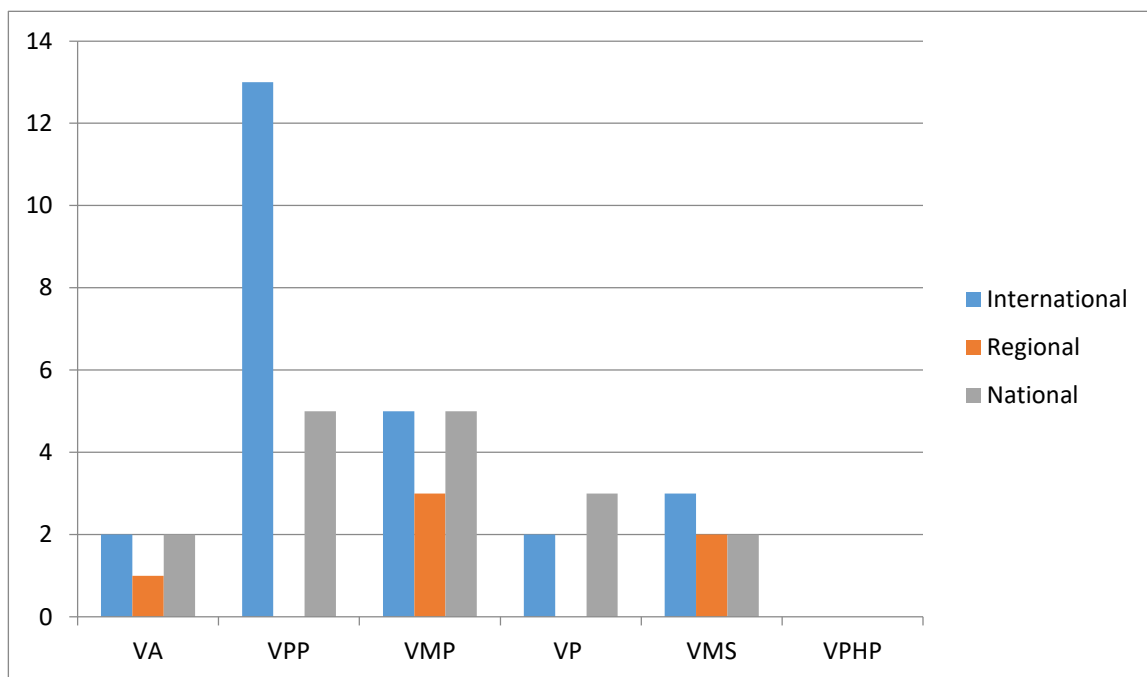

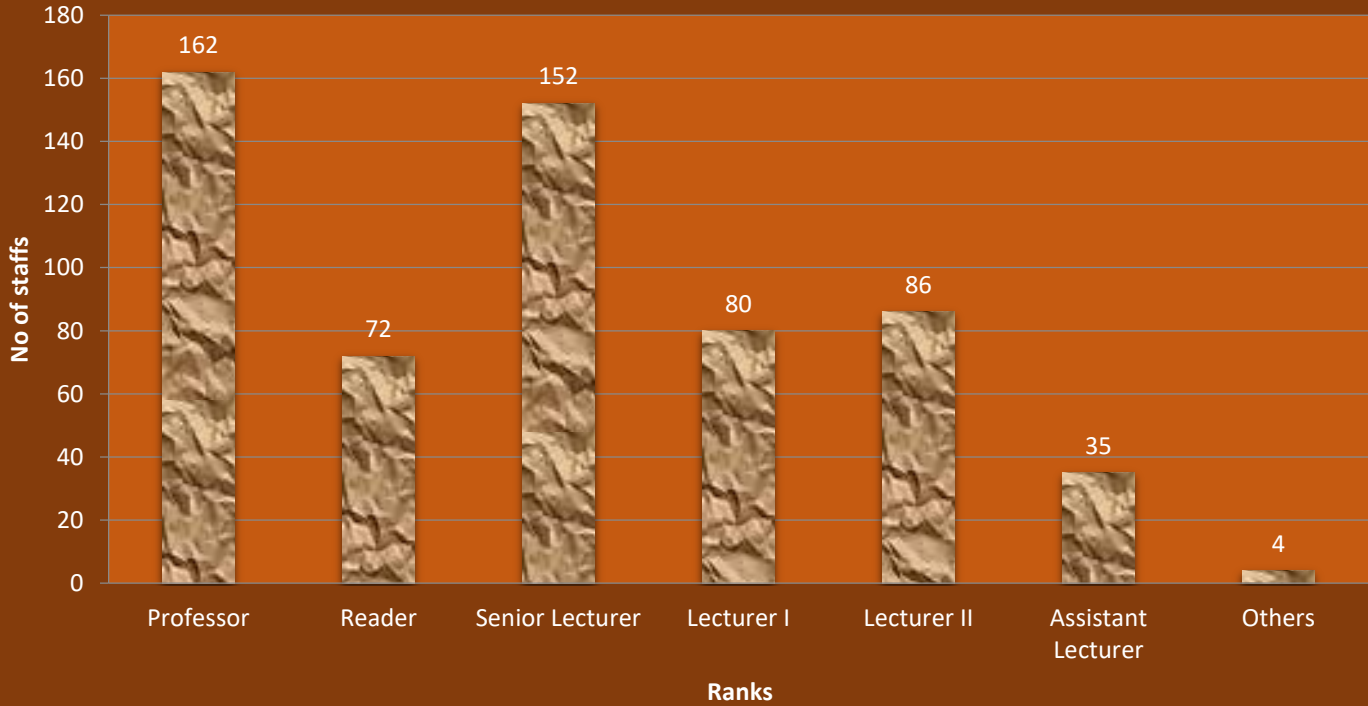

### ACADEMIC STAFF BY RANK AS AT DECEMBER , 2018

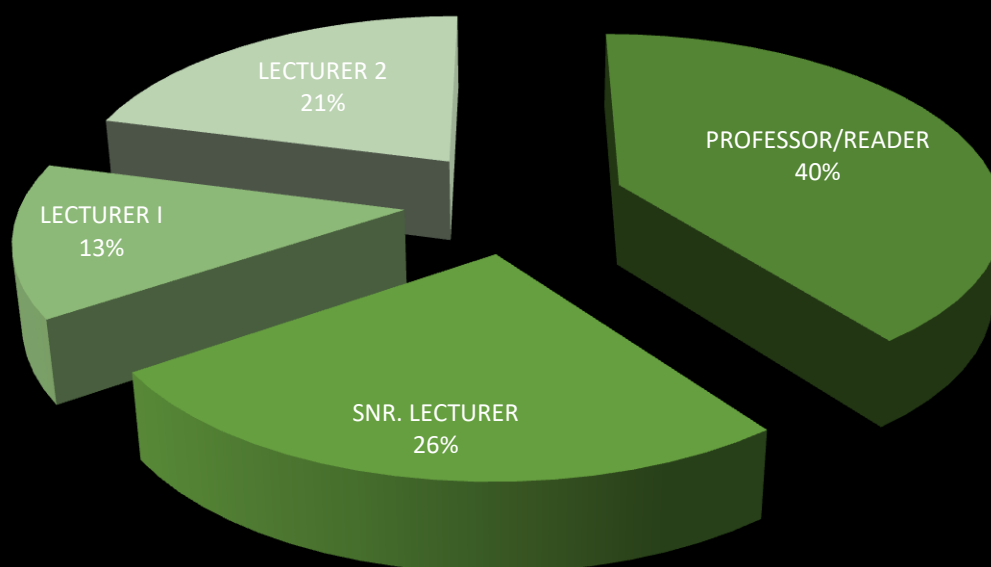


### ACADEMIC STAFF RANK BY PERCENTAGE

## ACADEMIC STAFF MIX AS AT DECEMBER, 2018



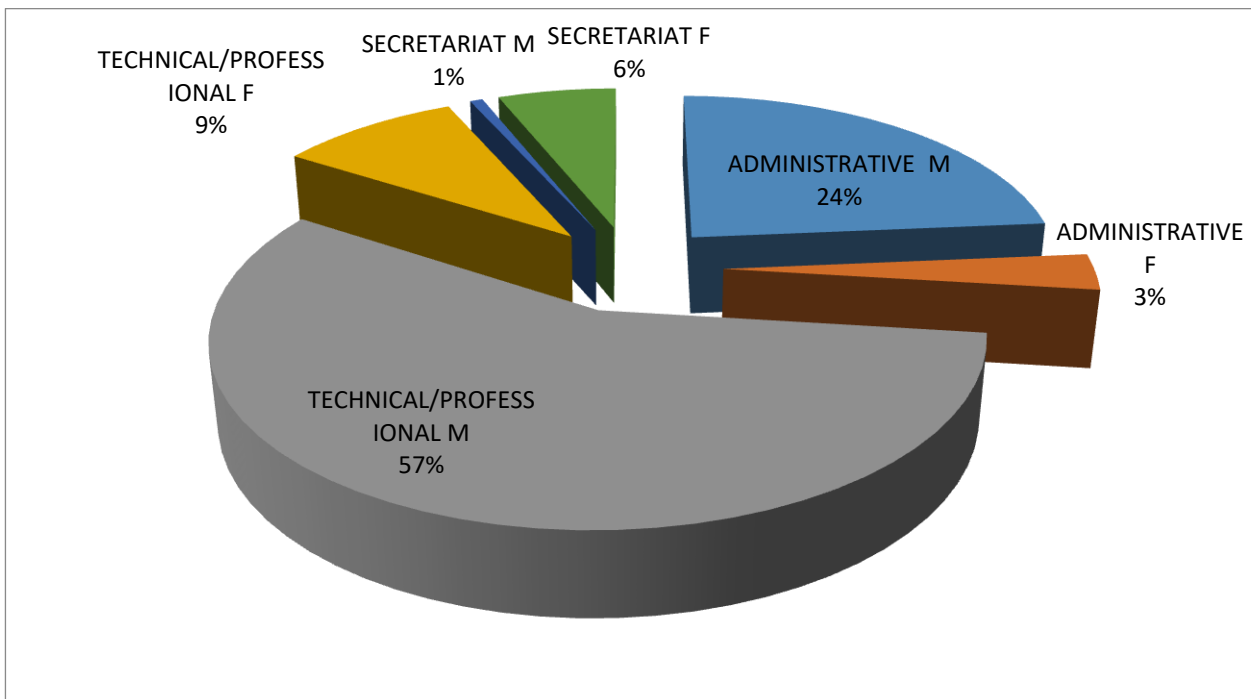

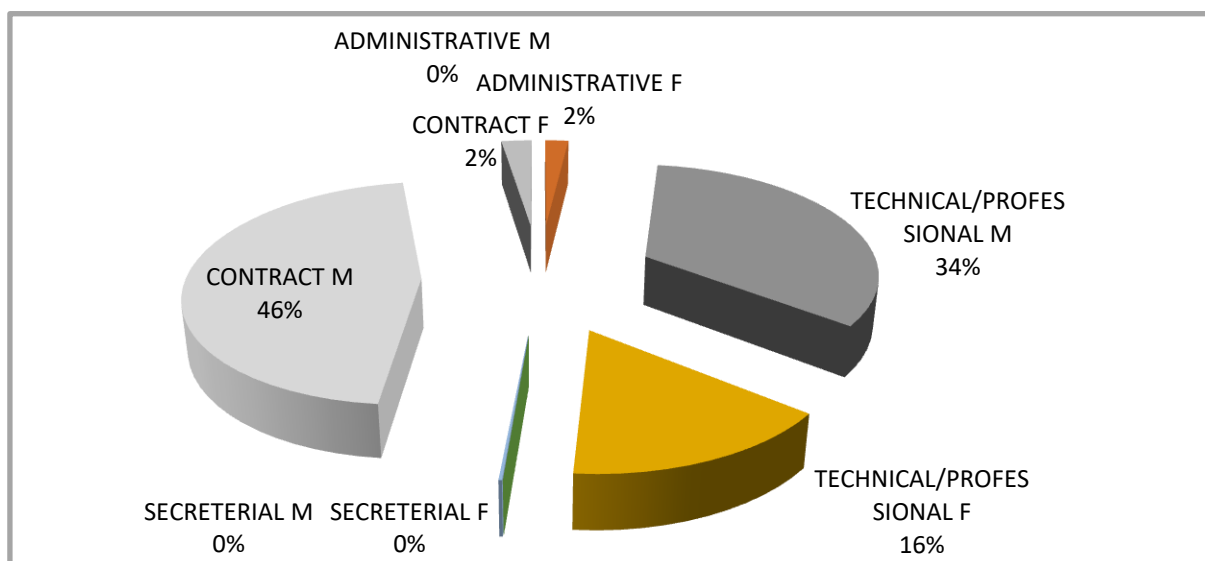
### 5.2.2 Senior Non-Teaching Staff in Percentage as at December, 2018

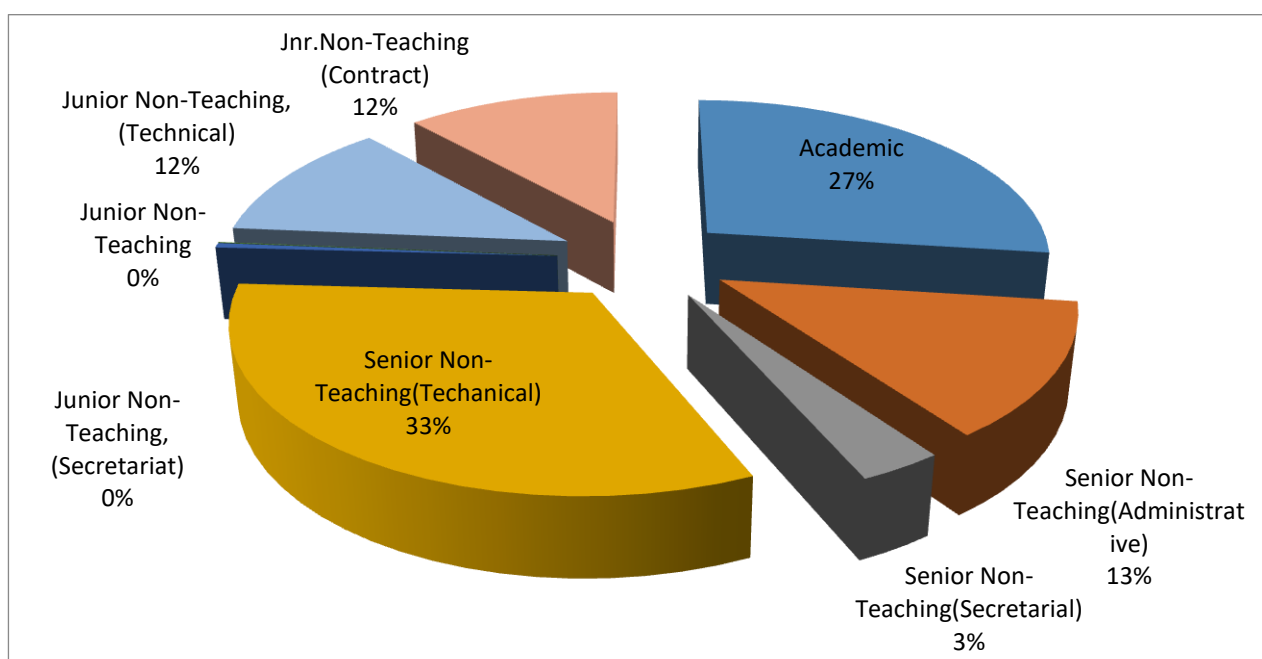
**5.2.4 Figure: Junior Non Teaching Staff in Percentage as at December, 2018**

## CHAPTER VI

### 6.0. THE CROWNING YEAR FOR FUNAAB RADIO

Indeed, the year 2018 has been the crowning year for FUNAAB Radio. After a 10-year wait, owing to regulatory hurdles, the dream by the University for the Establishment and sustenance of a broadcast outfit to enhance stakeholders and campus communication eventually came to fruition during the current administration of Prof Felix Kolawole Salako.

FUNAAB Radio (**the Sound of abundance**) made history on Monday March 26, 2018 when it eventually blared into the airwaves to flag-off terrestrial transmission via its assigned frequency, **89.5fm**, to the delight of all.

It is very significant to mention that the current Vice-Chancellor, Professor Salako, played very key roles in the making of FUNAAB Radio at three different but critical junctions of the University's voyage in respect of the radio project.

First, as Director of the Agricultural Media Resources and Extension Centre (AMREC), Professor Salako initiated and developed the blueprint with which the Committee on FUNAAB Radio worked upon. Later, Professor Salako simply amplified his contributions when he became the Deputy Vice-Chancellor, Development in 2011 with FUNAAB Radio directly under his ambit of supervision.

It is also remarkable that FUNAAB Radio became an instant success in the first few weeks and months of operation to the extent that in July 2018, the station, after being granted a full commercial transmission status by the National Broadcasting Commission (NBC), has passed the test of viability.

In the three-month period between July and September, 2018, **FUNAAB Radio netted into the University's coffers, over N1million**, being revenues generated through advertisement.

So far, FUNAAB Radio is truly living up to its Vision of aspiring *to be the leading broadcast station with excellence and professionalism, providing an interface for knowledge, information and entertainment*. The station, operating purely as a training centre for students to develop their broadcast potentials, have been performing the feat of seamless Live Transmission of major official events of the University.
